INTERIM JOINT COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS TO MEET

PIERRE –The Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations will hold their first meeting of the 2019 interim on Wednesday, May 22, 2019. The meeting will begin at 10:00 a.m. (CT) in Appropriations Room 362 of the State Capitol in Pierre, South Dakota.

The Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations, co-chaired by Senator John Wiik (R-Big Stone City) and Representative Chris Karr (R-Sioux Falls), will discuss and adopt Letters of Intent to be sent to various state agencies. A Letter of Intent supplements a piece of legislation with specific policy guidelines and viewpoints the Committee held during approval of that appropriation or legislation. The Committee will also discuss dates and sites for the interim state facility tours and future meeting dates and topics for the interim. In addition, representatives from the Board of Regents will present on plans to replace the University Center in Sioux Falls with a new college under the University of South Dakota.
