### **Letter of Intent Regarding Legislation Approved in the 2013 Session**

Dear Secretary Malsam-Rysdon:

This Letter of Intent sets forth a particular view held by the Joint Committee on Appropriations in approving your appropriation in the 2013 Legislative Session. As such, it supplements that appropriation with a specific policy guideline as approved on March 25, 2013.

While the guideline does not have the direct force of statutory law, it rests solidly on a long-standing tradition of Legislative-Executive relationships in South Dakota and it will be used by the Joint Committee as one basis for the fiscal oversight of your agency and its continued funding.

The 2013 South Dakota Legislature approved a one-time, nonrecurring increase to Providers in SB90 which amended the FY13 General Appropriations Act.

It is the goal of the Joint Committee on Appropriations that these funds provide a 1% one-time, nonrecurring increase to all providers and an additional one-time, nonrecurring 1% to Long-Term Care Providers, Elderly Nutrition Program-Senior Meals, In-Home Services for the Elderly, Child Protection Group Care Providers, Psychiatric Residential Treatment Providers, Substance Abuse Providers, and Community Mental Health Centers in the department of Social Services; as well as the community based services in the departments of Corrections, Human Services, UJS and Health as shown on Attachment 1 to this letter.

It is also the intent of the Joint Committee on Appropriations that only in-state facilities qualify for these one-time funds. Additionally, to reduce administrative burden, no payment less than \$100 shall be made.

In addition, it is also expected that you will be prepared to address this guideline in your FY15 budget presentation to the Joint Committee next January.
