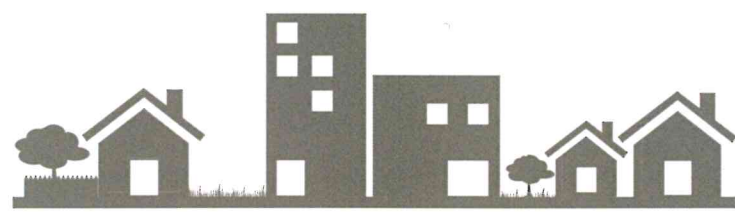

A Brief Overview

HOUSING OPPORTUNITY FUND

The Housing Opportunity Fund program was created with the passing of Senate Bill 235, the "Building South Dakota Fund," during the 2013 Legislative Session. The Housing Opportunity Fund (HOF) was designed to promote economic development in South Dakota by expanding the supply of decent, safe, sanitary and affordable housing targeted to low and moderate income families and individuals in South Dakota. The Housing Opportunity Fund may be used for new construction, the purchase and rehabilitation of rental or homeownership housing, housing preservation, homelessness prevention activities and community land trusts.

The South Dakota Housing Development Authority (SDHDA) and the SDHDA Board of Commissioners are responsible for the administration of the Housing Opportunity Fund in accordance with SDCL 11-13. SDHDA developed an allocation plan that provides a system to award HOF funds and HOF program income.

Housing opportunities financed by HOF serve individuals and families at or below 115 percent of the Area Median Income (AMI) for the corresponding county. SDHDA distributes HOF funds geographically throughout the state with 30 percent of the funds targeted for Sioux Falls and Rapid City and 70 percent of the funds targeted for the rest of the state.

Any for-profit entity, non-profit entity, tribal government, housing authority, political subdivision of South Dakota or its agencies, or any agency of South Dakota is eligible to apply for Housing Opportunity Funds. Individuals are only allowed to apply for program funding through HOF recipients.

SDHDA holds an application cycle annually at the end of August.

Applications for the 2016 fiscal year were due August 31, 2015. A total of \$6.1 million was requested. As a result of the application cycle, 393 families will benefit from more than \$2.6 million awarded to 20 projects. The projects consist of new construction and rehabilitation of single family homes and multifamily units, homelessness prevention programs and homebuyer assistance.

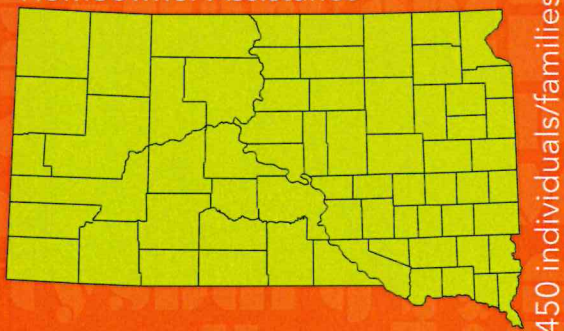

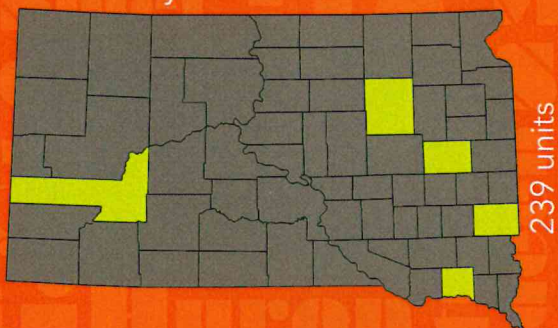

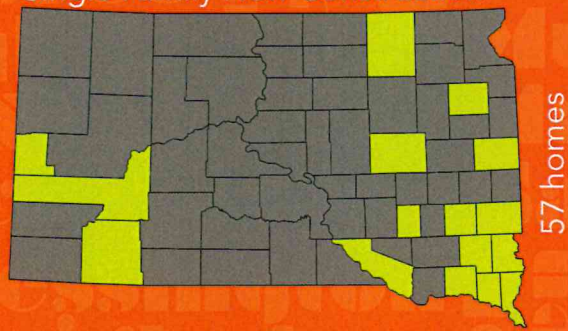
Multifamily New Construction



Multifamily Rehabilitation



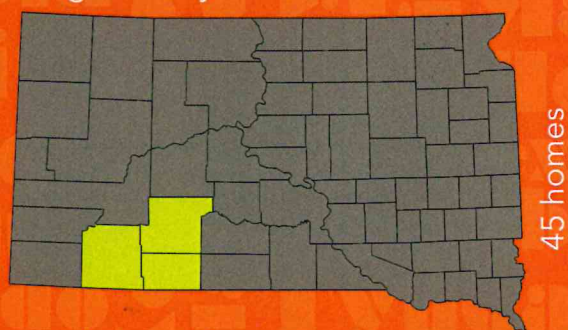
Single Family New Construction



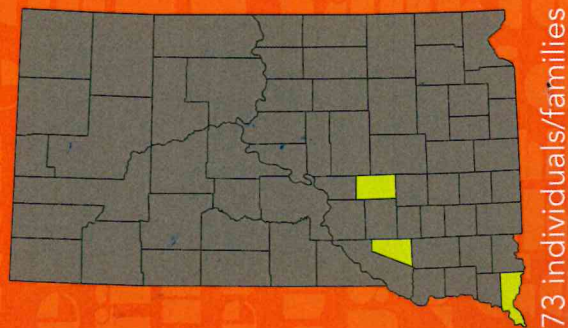
Single Family Acquisition/Rehabilitation
