Currently, the Division of Behavioral Health conducts six months post services follow-up questionnaires for clients who complete evidence-based treatment funded through the criminal justice initiative.

- 3) **Of the 22 additional inpatient beds needed, how many clients would use that bed per year? What is the cost per client?** (Follow-up to question #3 in *Offenses Regarding Controlled Substance* 10.22.19 document):

The \$1.7 million would serve approximately 260 clients based on the average cost per client in FY19.
