

Transition Age Youth Program

- Independent living program serves young adults identified with serious emotional disturbance (SED) or serious mental illness (SMI) as they transition into adulthood.
- The program coordinates housing, mental health services, and independent living skills.
- **Eligibility Criteria:**
 - 18-21 years old who meet SED or SMI criteria
 - Demonstrate the need for independent living assistance as a result of their mental illness
- **Providers:**
 - Lutheran Social Services provides housing and life skill development
 - Behavior Management Systems provides mental health services
- **Clients Served:**
 - FY19: 36

Room and Board Services

- Residential housing for clients who meet SMI criteria, including those with co-occurring substance use disorders, and who, due to their illness, are unable to function in an independent living arrangement.
- **Eligibility Criteria:**
 - 18 years of age and older
- **Providers:**
 - Behavior Management Systems, Capital Area Counseling Services, Human Service Agency
- **Clients Served:**
 - FY19: 76

Path Services

- PATH is a federal grant to reduce or eliminate homelessness for adults with SMI or co-occurring SMI and substance use disorders (SUD), who are experiencing homelessness or are at imminent risk of becoming homelessness.
- **Services Provided:**
 - Street Outreach
 - Case Management
 - Rental Payments
 - Security Deposit Assistance
- **Providers:**
 - Behavior Management Systems, Dakota Counseling Institute, Human Service Agency, Lewis and Clark Behavioral Health Services, Southeastern Behavioral HealthCare
