1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Expressing solidarity with Israel in its defense against
2 terrorism in the Gaza Strip.

3 WHEREAS, the State of Israel is the greatest ally of the United States in the Middle East;
4 and

5 WHEREAS, the Hamas terror organization's charter calls for the destruction of the State of
6 Israel; and

7 WHEREAS, Palestinian terrorists of the Islamic Jihad and Hamas in the Gaza Strip,
8 sponsored and trained by Iran, have recently fired hundreds of rockets at civilian targets in
9 southern Israel, ending a six-month cease fire with Israel in declaration and deed; and



1 WHEREAS, during the six-month "state of calm," Israel allowed the entrance of some
2 seventeen thousand truckloads of humanitarian aid into the Gaza Strip, while Palestinian
3 terrorists launched five hundred thirty-eight rockets and mortars into Israel; and

4 WHEREAS, the latest terrorist attacks took place only days after the United Nations
5 Security Council adopted Resolution 1850, which unanimously declared support for the peace
6 process between the Palestinians and Israelis; and

7 WHEREAS, since these latest terrorist attacks and the beginning of its military operation
8 on December 27, 2008, Israel has allowed the entrance of hundreds of truckloads of
9 humanitarian aid into the Gaza Strip in full coordination with donor Arab countries and
10 international aid organizations, including the Red Cross, out of respect for human rights and
11 lives and in an effort to minimize the hardship and suffering of the Palestinian population; and

12 WHEREAS, Israel's military operations are an effort to defend its citizens as a moral duty
13 against the unspeakable horrors of ongoing, indiscriminate terrorism and are aimed only at
14 dismantling the terrorist infrastructure; and

15 WHEREAS, hundreds of innocent Israeli and Palestinian civilians have been tragically
16 killed due to ongoing escalations of violence initiated by Palestinian terrorist organizations:

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Eighty-
18 fourth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the
19 Legislature:

- 20 (1) Stands in solidarity with Israel as it takes necessary steps to provide security to its
21 people;
- 22 (2) Remains committed to Israel's right to self-defense and supports additional United
23 States assistance to help Israel defend herself;
- 24 (3) Condemns the end of the cease fire by Hamas;

- 1 (4) Condemns the firing of rockets into civilian areas by the Iran-sponsored terrorist
- 2 groups of Hamas and the Islamic Jihad;
- 3 (5) Urges all Arab states to declare their opposition to terrorism and attacks on civilians;
- 4 (6) Urges all parties in the region to pursue lasting peace in the Middle East; and
- 5 (7) Will work as an elected body to promote economic relations, bilateral trade, and
- 6 partnerships in green technologies and alternative energy with the State of Israel to
- 7 stimulate the economies of both the United States and Israel in this time of crisis.
