FUNDING SOURCES**

COMPANY 20XX – FEDERAL FUNDS

- Use of 2027 Federal Fund: Company 2027 is used to record expenditures and revenues relating to grants from National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCA), and the Department of Justice (DOJ).
- Use of 2035 Federal Fund: Company 2035 is used to record expenditures and revenues relating to grants from FEMA and Department of Homeland Security.

FUNDING SOURCES**

COMPANY 3040 – STATE HIGHWAY FUND (OTHER FUNDS)

- Use of State Highway Funds: Highway funds are used to support Highway Patrol and Motor Carrier activities.

- Statutory authority:

32-2-11. Fund from which compensation is paid--Vouchers. Compensation fixed under § 32- 2-10 and expenses incurred by agents, patrolmen, and employees of the Division of Highway Patrol, and the salary of the superintendent, may be paid out of the state highway fund, and such payments shall be made upon vouchers properly executed and presented in the manner prescribed by law.

32-2-12. General duties of division. Except as otherwise specifically provided, the Division of Highway Patrol is entrusted with the enforcement of all laws, police regulations, and rules governing the operation of motor vehicles and motor carriers.

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
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COMPANY 3048 – BOILER INSPECTION FUND (OTHER FUNDS)

- Use of the Boiler Inspection Fund: The purpose of this fund is to provide a depository for boiler inspection fees, and for expenditures of the boiler inspection program.

- Statutory Authority: 4-4-4.5. Boiler inspection fund established--Permitted expenditures. There shall be established within the state treasury the boiler inspection fund, into which shall be deposited all boiler inspection fees received by the Department of Public Safety. All moneys in the fund created by this section shall be budgeted and expended in accordance with the provisions of Title 4 on warrants drawn by the state auditor on vouchers approved by the secretary of the Department of Public Safety. Expenditures from these funds may be made only to pay necessary expenses of purposes specified in chapter 34-29A.

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
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COMPANY 3072 – DENR OTHER FUNDS
(Funding source identifier 248)

- Use of DENR Other Funds: These costs are related to the salaries, travel, and central service charges expended in administering the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Program (USDOT) and for paying duty officer salaries.

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**COMPANY 3144 – SPECIAL EMERGENCY AND DISASTER FUND
(OTHER FUNDS)**

(Funding source identifiers 253, 254)

- Use of the Special Emergency and Disaster Fund: To provide a conduit to make expenditures to meet special emergency requirements.

- Statutory Authority: 33-15-23. Special emergency and disaster special revenue fund. There is hereby created a fund to be known as the "special emergency and disaster special revenue fund." Expenditures may be made from the fund to meet special emergency requirements of the Division of Emergency Management, not included in the general and special appropriations which provide for the ordinary operation and maintenance of functions of this department, and for carrying into effect the objectives and provisions of this chapter. No part of this fund may revert to the general fund. Withdrawal from this fund shall be made on warrants drawn by the state auditor on vouchers signed by the secretary of public safety.

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
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COMPANY 3144 – SD 911 COORDINATION FUND (OTHER FUNDS)
(Funding source identifier 717)

- Use of the SD 911 Coordination Fund: To account for monies collected from prepaid wireless telecommunications service pursuant to § 34-45-4 shall be deposited in the South Dakota 911 coordination fund. The board may authorize disbursements from the fund pursuant to this chapter for approved nonrecurring costs requested by the governing body of eligible 911 public safety answering points.
- Statutory Authority: 34-45-12. 911 coordination fund created. There is hereby created within the state treasury the South Dakota 911 coordination fund. Any funds collected from prepaid wireless telecommunications service pursuant to § 34-45-4 shall be deposited in the South Dakota 911 coordination fund. The board may authorize disbursements from the fund pursuant to this chapter for approved nonrecurring costs requested by the governing body of eligible 911 public safety answering points.

34-45-4. Monthly uniform charge--Use of proceeds. Upon compliance with § 34-45-2, the governing body may assess a monthly uniform charge in an amount not to exceed seventy-five cents per service user line. Any prepaid wireless telecommunications service provider shall remit the 911 emergency surcharge for each active prepaid wireless telecommunication service user account to the South Dakota 911 coordination fund. The proceeds are continuously appropriated for reimbursement of nonrecurring and recurring costs of 911 service and operating expenses of the board. No such charge may be imposed upon more than one hundred service user lines or equivalent service, per customer account billed, per month. In the case of multi-station network systems, service user lines shall be equal to the number of calls that can simultaneously be made from such system to the public switched telephone network.

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
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COMPANY 3177 – STATE MOTOR VEHICLE FUND (OTHER FUNDS)
(Funding source identifier 674)

- Use of the State Motor Vehicle Fund:
 - Fund the Driver Licensing program;
 - Provide matching funds for the Accident Records SPR grant through SDDOT;
 - Provide matching funds for Highway Safety planning and administration grant funds (this is the only portion of Highway Safety grant funds that requires cash match);
 - Cover indirect costs related to the above programs.

Note: Highway Patrol funding from the Motor Vehicle Fund is covered under funding source identifier 771 on the next page.

- Statutory Authority:

32-11-30. Expenses of administration. All expenses in administering the state motor vehicle and driver functions shall be paid from the motor vehicle fund.

- Reversion:

Excess funds are reverted to the Local Government Highway and Bridge Fund around August 1 of each year (SDCL 32-11-32). To calculate the reversion, one month's expenditures, based on the current year budget, plus the estimated indirect costs for the current year, are subtracted from the June 30 cash balance.

**COMPANY 3177 – STATE MOTOR VEHICLE FUND
HIGHWAY PATROL FEES (OTHER FUNDS)**
(Funding source identifier 771)

- Use of the State Motor Vehicle Fund: SB32 was passed by the 2009 legislature. It created two fees to support the operation of the highway patrol.

Section 1. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as follows: There is hereby imposed a fee of one dollar on each vehicle registered and licensed in this state for the purpose of administering the Division of Highway Patrol. Before any vehicle is registered pursuant to chapter 32-5 or 32-9, the county treasurer or Department of Revenue and Regulation shall collect the highway patrol fee. Before any vehicle is registered pursuant to chapter 32-10, the Department of Revenue and Regulation shall collect the highway patrol fee. The fee shall be credited to the state motor vehicle fund.

Section 2. That § 32-12-16 be amended to read as follows: 32-12-16. The fee for an original driver license or a renewal of a driver license is twenty dollars. The fee for a duplicate license, a name change, or an address change is ten dollars. The fee shall be credited to the state motor vehicle fund. Five dollars of every fee for an original or renewal license collected pursuant to this section shall be used to administer the Division of Highway Patrol.

- Reversion:

Excess funds are reverted to the Local Government Highway and Bridge Fund around August 1 of each year (SDCL 32-11-32). To calculate the reversion, one month's expenditures, based on the current year budget, plus the estimated indirect costs for the current year, are subtracted from the June 30 cash balance.

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
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COMPANY 3184 – MOTORCYCLE SAFETY FUND (OTHER FUNDS)

(Funding source identifier 616)

- Use of the Motorcycle Safety Fund: Use of this fund is defined in SDCL 32-20-14. Its purpose is to provide motorcycle safety courses and motorcycle safety education.
- Statutory Authority:

32-5-10.2. Motorcycle safety education fee--Deposit in special revenue fund. The county treasurer shall remit to the department the motorcycle safety education fees collected pursuant to § 32-5-10.1. The fees shall be deposited in the state treasury in a special revenue fund for use as specified in § 32-20-14.

32-20-14. Motorcycle safety education--Standards and procedures--Funding. Any revenue derived from the fee imposed by § 32-5-10.1 and appropriated pursuant to § 32-20-15 shall be used to provide motorcycle safety courses and motorcycle safety education approved by the director of the Office of Highway Safety. The director shall promulgate rules pursuant to chapter 1-26 establishing instruction standards, teacher or instructor certification standards, and course approval procedures. The director shall administer the fund created by § 32-5-10.2, may conduct audits and otherwise examine the records of approved motorcycle courses and may require other information that is considered necessary to evaluate the quality of motorcycle safety courses and safety education.

32-11-29. Amounts credited to state motor vehicle fund--Encumbrance of special revenue fund for motorcycle safety education. The following fees:

- (1) Fees collected under §§ 32-3-57, 32-5-99, 32-5-111, and 32-7A-14.1;
- (2) The two percent of motor vehicle license collections referred to in § 32-11-4.1;
- (3) The title fees collected under §§ 32-3-18 and 32-3-27;

shall be credited to the state motor vehicle fund. **All revenues not appropriated from the special revenue fund established by § 32-5-10.2 shall remain in the fund for the next fiscal year and be used solely for purposes of motorcycle safety courses and motorcycle safety education.**

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COMPANY 3184 – OTHER FUNDS (ADMINISTRATION)
(Funding source identifier 001)

- Use of Administration Fund: Tracks administrative costs that are recovered from other programs through the department's indirect cost plan.
- Statutory Authority: None - administratively created.

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**COMPANY 3184 – CIGARETTE FIRE SAFETY ACT FUND
(OTHER FUNDS)**

(Funding source identifier 832)

Effective January 1, 2011

- Use of the Cigarette Fire Safety Act Fund & Statutory Authority:

34-49-18. (Section effective January 1, 2011) Cigarette fire safety standard act fund created. There is hereby established in the state treasury a special fund to be known as the cigarette fire safety standard act fund. The fund shall consist of all certification fees paid under this chapter and all moneys recovered as penalties under this chapter. The moneys shall be deposited to the credit of the fund and shall, in addition to any other moneys made available for such purpose, be made available to the Department of Public Safety, Department of Revenue and Regulation, and the Office of Attorney General for administering the provisions of this chapter.

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
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COMPANY 6022 – INSPECTIONS (OTHER FUNDS)

- Use of the Inspections Fund: Internal service fund for the administration of the inspections program.
- Statutory Authority: None – administratively created.
