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On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 6 to 15, inclusive, and insert:

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" The secretary of revenue may prepare a list of at least one hundred delinquent persons who
15 owe the largest amount of tax for chapters 10-45, 10-45D, 10-46, 10-46E, 10-46A, 10-46B,
16 10-52, 10-52A, 10-58, and 10-33A and § 32-5B-20, and that are delinquent in the payment of
17 tax for chapters 10-45, 10-45D, 10-46, 10-46E, 10-46A, 10-46B, 10-52, 10-52A, 10-58, and
18 10-33A and § 32-5B-20 to the department, if a lien has been filed against the person. The list
19 shall include at least the top one hundred persons with total delinquent final liabilities for tax
20 in chapters 10-45, 10-45D, 10-46, 10-46E, 10-46A, 10-46B, 10-52, 10-52A, 10-58, and 10-33A
21 and § 32-5B-20, including penalties and interest. The list shall contain the person's name; the
22 business name, if any; address; and the amount of total tax, penalties and interest outstanding
23 of each delinquent person.

Section 2. That chapter 10-59 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
25 follows:

25

26

At least ninety days before the disclosure of the name of a delinquent person prescribed in
27 section 1 of this Act, the secretary of revenue shall mail a written notice to the delinquent person
28 at that person's last known address informing the person that the failure to resolve the tax
29 delinquency could result in the person's name being included in a list of delinquent persons that
30 is published on the internet on a web site maintained by the department pursuant to this Act. If
31 the delinquent tax has not been paid within ninety days after the notice was mailed, and the
32 person has not, since the mailing of the notice, either paid the delinquent tax or entered into a
33 written agreement with the department for payment of the delinquency or corrected a default in

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1 an existing agreement to the satisfaction of the secretary, the secretary may disclose the tax
2 delinquency in the list of delinquent persons."

3 On page 2, delete lines 1 to 12, inclusive.

4 On page 2, line 15, after "disclosure" insert "described in section 1 of this Act".

5 On page 3, delete lines 3 and 4, and insert "The name of a person on the list described in
6 section 1 of this Act shall be removed within ten days after the delinquent debt payment has
7 been processed by the department."

8 And that as so amended said bill do pass.
