11 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Requesting that a United States Navy submarine be named  
12 the USS *South Dakota*.

13 WHEREAS, Congress and the Department of the Navy have long maintained an interest in  
14 how Navy ships are named; and

15 WHEREAS, names for Navy ships traditionally have been chosen and announced by the  
16 Secretary of the Navy, under the direction of the President and in accordance with rules  
17 prescribed by Congress. Rules for giving certain types of names to certain types of Navy ships  
18 have evolved over time; and

19 WHEREAS, currently, Virginia (SSN-774) class attack submarines are being named for  
20 states. These include the *Virginia*, *Texas*, *Hawaii*, *North Carolina*, *New Mexico*, and *Missouri*,  
21 which are all in active service. In 2011, the *California* was added, along with the *Mississippi*,  
22 *Minnesota*, *North Dakota*, and *John Warner*, all currently under construction; and

23 WHEREAS, current Midwestern states and cities that have submarines named after them  
24 include the USS *North Dakota* SSN-784, USS *Minnesota* SSN-783, USS *Missouri* SSN-779,  
25 USS *Cheyenne* SSN-773, USS *Boise* SSN-764, USS *Wyoming* SSBN-742, USS *Nebraska*  
26 SSBN-739, USS *Helena* SSN-725, USS *Minneapolis/St. Paul* SSN-708, and USS *Omaha*  
27 SSN-692:

28 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Eighty-  
29 seventh Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the South  
30 Dakota Legislature, together with members of the public and the United States Submarine  
31 Veterans Inc. (USSVI) Scorpion Base in Sioux Falls and Polaris Base in Rapid City, request the  
32 United States Congress and the Secretary of the Navy to support the naming of a United States  
33 Navy submarine for the State of South Dakota. Tradition, history, and honor will be maintained  
34 in naming a new United States Navy submarine after the historic battleship USS *South Dakota*.

15 Speaker declared the bill passed and the title was agreed to.
