17 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Directing the Department of Game, Fish and Parks to
18 return a mountain lion carcass or pelt to a certain Harding County resident and to reconsider
19 its policy with respect to possession of mountain lion carcasses and pelts.

20 WHEREAS, based on state law recognizing wildlife as the property of the public and
21 allowing licensed hunters to possess wildlife animals taken according to the terms of the license,
22 the Department of Game, Fish and Parks will confiscate the carcasses and pelts of mountain
23 lions that are taken outside the terms of a hunting license, regardless of any extenuating
24 circumstances in individual situations; and

25 WHEREAS, SDCL 41-6-29.1 authorizes a person, licensed or unlicensed, to kill a mountain
26 lion if reasonably necessary to protect the life of any person or if the mountain lion poses an
27 imminent threat to the person's livestock or pets; and

28 WHEREAS, on November 19, 2011, a rancher from Harding County who possessed a
29 license to hunt mountain lions was feeding his sheep when his cattle dogs disappeared. After
30 he finished feeding, he searched for the dogs and found them barking at a mountain lion in a
31 tree. He immediately took his .22 magnum rifle, which he keeps with him at all times, and shot
32 the lion. He then called Game, Fish and Parks to report his kill as instructed on the license. The
33 game warden came to the ranch and confiscated the mountain lion, even though the rancher had
34 a valid license to hunt mountain lions. The rancher not only shot the mountain lion with a too
35 small caliber rifle, but he also told the warden about his dogs finding the mountain lion, and
36 state law prohibits the use of dogs in hunting mountain lions. The rancher has purchased a
37 license to hunt mountain lions for several years because he wanted to keep the lion if he ever
38 shot one; and

1 WHEREAS, in this case, the immediate circumstances of the situation made it impossible,
2 or extremely imprudent and potentially threatening to life or property, to follow all of the
3 requirements of the mountain lion hunting license with respect to caliber of the weapon and the
4 presence of dogs. The person in question held a valid mountain lion hunting license, acted in
5 a prudent manner to address what could have been an emergency situation, and reported his
6 actions promptly and honestly to the Department of Game, Fish and Parks; and

7 WHEREAS, the interpretation of state statute resulting in the confiscation of the mountain
8 lion in this instance is unfair and falls outside the spirit of the statute:

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Eighty-
10 seventh Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the South
11 Dakota Legislature requests the Department of Game, Fish and Parks, in the case described in
12 this resolution, to return the mountain lion carcass or pelt to the licensed hunter who shot the
13 mountain lion; and

26 WHEREAS, based on state law recognizing wildlife as the property of the public and
27 allowing licensed hunters to possess wildlife animals taken according to the terms of the license,
28 the Department of Game, Fish and Parks will confiscate the carcasses and pelts of mountain
29 lions that are taken outside the terms of a hunting license, regardless of any extenuating
30 circumstances in individual situations; and

31 WHEREAS, SDCL 41-6-29.1 authorizes a person, licensed or unlicensed, to kill a mountain
32 lion if reasonably necessary to protect the life of any person or if the mountain lion poses an
33 imminent threat to the person's livestock or pets; and

34 WHEREAS, on December 25, 2011, a rancher from Butte County shot a 130-pound
35 mountain lion in the ranch yard thirty feet from his house. He had been having a problem with
36 raccoons, and when he saw eyes reflected in the yard light, he fired his .22, thinking it was either
37 a raccoon or a skunk. His three-year-old granddaughter had been playing within a few feet of
38 where he shot the mountain lion until she was called into the ranch house for supper. He held

1 a valid license to hunt mountain lions, and he called Game, Fish and Parks as required. The
2 game warden confiscated the mountain lion because the caliber rifle that was used was too small
3 and the animal was shot after dark; and

4 WHEREAS, in this case, the immediate circumstances of the situation made it impossible,
5 or extremely imprudent and potentially threatening to life or property, to follow all of the
6 requirements of the mountain lion hunting license with respect to caliber of the weapon and
7 shooting hours. The person in question held a valid mountain lion hunting license, acted in a
8 prudent manner to address what could have been an emergency situation, and reported his
9 actions promptly and honestly to the Department of Game, Fish and Parks; and

10 WHEREAS, the interpretation of state statute resulting in the confiscation of mountain lions
11 in this instance is unfair and falls outside the spirit of the statute:

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Eighty-
13 seventh Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the South

4 suppression of wildfires in the state and to declare an emergency.

5 SB 38: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to provide for the transfer of control of an
6 office building in Rapid City, to make an appropriation for the construction and renovation of
7 the office building, and to declare an emergency.

8 SB 45: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to appropriate additional funds and to extend
9 the availability of appropriations to replace storage facilities at the Cottonwood Agricultural
10 Experiment Station.

11 SB 50: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise the permissible uses of the cigarette
12 fire safety standard act fund.

13 And signed the same in the presence of the House.

14 Rep. Turbiville moved that the House do now adjourn, which motion prevailed and at
15 4:25 p.m. the House adjourned.
