WHEREAS, Myron Floren was highly regarded by Lawrence Welk, who was an accomplished accordion player in his own right; and

WHEREAS, Myron Floren was among the first class of inductees into the Scandinavian-American Hall of Fame in 1984 and inducted into the International Polka Music Hall of Fame in 1990; and

WHEREAS, Myron Floren, a first-generation American who was born in Roslyn in Day County, South Dakota, and was an Augustana graduate, who worked his way through college as "The Melody Man" on KSOO; and

WHEREAS, Myron Floren was awarded by the Confédération Internationale des Accordéonistes their Merit Award in recognition of his outstanding contributions to the international accordion movement:
