1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to repeal certain provisions relating to the Commission on  
2 Intergovernmental Cooperation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 2-9-25 be repealed.

5 ~~—2-9-25. The State Commission on Intergovernmental Cooperation is established to carry~~  
6 ~~forward the participation of this state as a member of the Council of State Governments, both~~  
7 ~~regionally and nationally, to confer with officials of other states, the federal government, and~~  
8 ~~local units of government, to formulate proposals for cooperation between this state and the~~  
9 ~~other states, to encourage and promote cooperation between local governments in this state,~~  
10 ~~between local governments in this state and the state government, and between local~~  
11 ~~governments in this state and local governments in the other states, and to organize and maintain~~  
12 ~~governmental machinery for such purposes.~~

13 Section 2. That § 2-9-26 be repealed.

14 ~~—2-9-26. The South Dakota Commission on Intergovernmental Cooperation shall be~~



1 ~~composed of the members of the Executive Board of the Legislative Research Council as set~~  
2 ~~forth in § 2-9-2.~~

3 ~~—The Governor shall be an honorary member of the commission and the chairman of the~~  
4 ~~Executive Board of the Legislative Research Council shall serve as secretary. The president pro~~  
5 ~~tempore of the Senate and speaker of the House of Representatives shall serve as cochairmen~~  
6 ~~of the commission.~~

7 Section 3. That § 2-9-27 be repealed.

8 ~~—2-9-27. The Commission on Intergovernmental Cooperation may establish such committees~~  
9 ~~and advisory boards as it deems advisable, to conduct conferences and to formulate proposals~~  
10 ~~concerning subjects of intergovernmental cooperation. Subject to the approval of the~~  
11 ~~commission, the members of every such committee and advisory board shall be appointed by~~  
12 ~~the cochairmen of the commission. State officials may be appointed as members of any such~~  
13 ~~committee or advisory board, and private citizens may serve on such board, but at least one~~  
14 ~~member of the commission shall be a member of every such committee and board.~~

15 ~~—The commission may establish such rules as it considers appropriate concerning the~~  
16 ~~membership and the functioning of any committee or board which it establishes.~~

17 Section 4. That § 2-9-28 be repealed.

18 ~~—2-9-28. The Commission on Intergovernmental Cooperation may employ such staff and~~  
19 ~~incur such other expenses as may be necessary for the proper performance of its duties, and it~~  
20 ~~may, by contributions to the Council of State Governments and other similar governmental~~  
21 ~~organizations affiliated with it, participate with other states in maintaining the said council's~~  
22 ~~regional and central secretariats and other similar governmental services.~~

23 ~~—No expenses, salaries, or other obligations shall be incurred by the commission unless there~~  
24 ~~are funds on hand, or provided for in advance, with which to pay the same.~~

1 Section 5. That § 2-9-29 be repealed.

2 ~~—2-9-29. The Commission on Intergovernmental Cooperation shall report to the Governor.~~
