1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding military speciality  
2 plates.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
5 follows:

6 Terms used in this Act mean,

7 (1) "Veteran," any person who meets the provisions of § 33A-2-1;

8 (2) "Owner," any person who owns a motor vehicle that is operated or driven on the  
9 public highways of this state or any person with written authorization to act on behalf  
10 of and as an agent for the owner;

11 (3) "Active duty," active duty in the United States armed forces; and

12 (4) "Service," service in the United States armed forces.

13 Section 2. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
14 follows:

15 Any owner may apply for a military specialty plate if the owner meets the requirements of



1 this Act. The available military specialty plates are as follows:

- 2 (1) National Guard plate;
- 3 (2) Disabled veteran plate;
- 4 (3) Veteran plate;
- 5 (4) Active duty plate;
- 6 (5) Prisoner of War plate;
- 7 (6) Pearl Harbor survivor plate;
- 8 (7) Gold Star plate;
- 9 (8) Purple Heart plate;
- 10 (9) Medal of Honor plate;
- 11 (10) Silver Star plate;
- 12 (11) Distinguished Service Cross plate;
- 13 (12) Navy Cross plate;
- 14 (13) Air Force Cross plate;
- 15 (14) Distinguished Flying Cross plate;
- 16 (15) Bronze Star with Valor plate; and
- 17 (16) Bronze Star plate.

18 Section 3. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
19 follows:

20 Any owner applying for a military specialty plate listed in section 2 of this Act shall meet  
21 the following general requirements:

- 22 (1) Be a resident of this state;
- 23 (2) Possess a valid South Dakota driver license;
- 24 (3) Comply with all state laws regarding registration and licensing; and

1 (4) Pay all associated fees pursuant to sections 6 and 7 of this Act.

2 Section 4. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
3 follows:

4 Any owner applying for a military specialty plate listed in section 2 of this Act shall meet  
5 the following specific additional requirements for the respective military specialty plate:

6 (1) Any applicant for the National Guard plate must be an active enlisted member of the  
7 National Guard, an active commissioned member of the National Guard, or a retired  
8 member of the National Guard with twenty years or more of creditable service;

9 (2) Any applicant for the disabled veteran plate must be a veteran who has been rated as  
10 in receipt of a statutory benefit for loss or loss of use of one or more extremities, a  
11 veteran who receives a veteran's allotment for a total service-connected disability, or  
12 a veteran who has received a United States Veterans Administration K Award. The  
13 disability must have been incurred while serving on active duty during a time of war  
14 or while participating in a military mission involving armed conflict;

15 (3) Any applicant for the veteran plate must be an honorably discharged veteran who  
16 served on active duty;

17 (4) Any applicant for the active duty plate must currently be serving on active duty;

18 (5) Any applicant for the Prisoner of War plate must be a veteran who was a prisoner of  
19 war while serving on active duty;

20 (6) Any applicant for the Pearl Harbor survivor plate must have survived the attack at  
21 Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on December 7, 1941, while serving on active duty, and have  
22 received an honorable discharge from the United States armed forces;

23 (7) Any applicant for the Gold Star plate must be a parent, spouse, sibling, or child of a  
24 member of the United States armed forces who died while serving this country on

1 active duty or as a result of that service;

2 (8) Any applicant for the Purple Heart plate must be a veteran who received the Purple  
3 Heart as a result of the applicant's service;

4 (9) Any applicant for the Medal of Honor plate must be a veteran who received the  
5 Medal of Honor as a result of the applicant's service;

6 (10) Any applicant for the Silver Star plate must have received the Silver Star as a result  
7 of the applicant's service;

8 (11) Any applicant for the Distinguished Service Cross plate must have received the  
9 Distinguished Service Cross as a result of the applicant's service;

10 (12) Any applicant for the Navy Cross plate must have received the Navy Cross as a result  
11 of the applicant's service;

12 (13) Any applicant for the Air Force Cross plate must have received the Air Force Cross  
13 as a result of the applicant's service;

14 (14) Any applicant for the Distinguished Flying Cross plate must have received the  
15 Distinguished Flying Cross as a result of the applicant's service;

16 (15) Any applicant for the Bronze Star with Valor plate must have received the Bronze  
17 Star with Valor as a result of the applicant's service; and

18 (16) Any applicant for the Bronze Star plate must have received the Bronze Star as a  
19 result of the applicant's service.

20 Section 5. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
21 follows:

22 Any owner applying for a military specialty plate shall submit an application, on a form  
23 prescribed by the secretary, to the county treasurer of the applicant's county of residence. Any  
24 applicant who submits a falsified application is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. The secretary

1 may, at any time, require the applicant to provide additional information to determine if the  
2 applicant meets the military specialty plate requirements. The secretary may confer with the  
3 Department of Military, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and the United States Department  
4 of Veterans Affairs, to determine if the applicant meets the military specialty plate requirements.

5 Section 6. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
6 follows:

7 In addition to the noncommercial annual registration and plate fees, each person receiving  
8 military specialty plates shall pay an additional ten dollar fee for the initial issuance of the  
9 military specialty plates. All fees collected under this section shall be placed in the license plate  
10 special revenue fund.

11 Section 7. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
12 follows:

13 Notwithstanding section 6 of this Act or any other contrary provisions of this Act, each  
14 veteran receiving the disabled veteran, Prisoner of War, Pearl Harbor survivor, or Purple Heart  
15 military specialty plates shall pay a ten dollar fee for the initial issuance of the military specialty  
16 plate and an annual fee of ten dollars for renewal decals, but is not subject to the annual  
17 registration fees assessed pursuant to § 32-5-6 or 32-5-9.

18 Notwithstanding section 6 of this Act or any other contrary provisions of this Act, each  
19 veteran receiving the Medal of Honor plate may not be assessed annual registration fees,  
20 pursuant to § 32-5-6 or 32-5-9, or any other fees associated with the military specialty plate or  
21 renewal decals.

22 Each veteran receiving a disabled veteran, Prisoner of War, Pearl Harbor survivor, Purple  
23 Heart, or Medal of Honor military specialty plate may get a maximum of two sets of the applied  
24 for military specialty plate. The plates may be placed on any automobile, pickup truck, or van

1 licensed pursuant to § 32-5-6 or a motorcycle licensed pursuant to § 32-5-9. The veteran may  
2 choose to place one of the two sets of military specialty plates on a noncommercial pickup truck,  
3 which weighs more than six thousand pounds, licensed pursuant to § 32-5-6.3, or a motor home  
4 licensed pursuant to § 32-5-6.1, but shall pay the regular annual registration fees pursuant to  
5 those sections.

6 Section 8. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
7 follows:

8 Each military specialty plate shall be reflectorized and validated with a decal each year in  
9 the same manner as a noncommercial license plate. Military specialty plates may only be used  
10 on automobiles, pickup trucks, or vans licensed pursuant to § 32-5-6, motorcycles licensed  
11 pursuant to § 32-5-9, pickup trucks licensed pursuant to § 32-5-6.3, or motor homes licensed  
12 pursuant to § 32-5-6.1. Military specialty plates shall be displayed in accordance with § 32-5-98.

13 Section 9. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
14 follows:

15 Military specialty plates shall be numbered and designed by the secretary, with the exception  
16 of the National Guard plate which shall be designed by the adjutant general and approved by the  
17 secretary. The military specialty plates shall meet the following specific requirements:

18 (1) The National Guard plate shall designate the owner as an active enlisted member of  
19 the National Guard, an active commissioned member of the National Guard, or a  
20 retired member of the National Guard;

21 (2) The disabled veteran plate shall consist of a white background bordered on the left  
22 by a blue field with white stars and on the right by alternating red and white stripes.

23 The words Disabled Veteran, shall be inscribed on the plate in blue, in at least ten  
24 point bold type;

- 1       (3)    The veteran plate shall designate the owner as a veteran. The plate may allow for  
2            additional indication of the conflict, rank, or status of the veteran;
- 3       (4)    The active duty plate shall designate the owner as currently serving on active duty.  
4            The plate may allow for additional indication of the conflict, rank, or status of the  
5            active duty member;
- 6       (5)    The Prisoner of War plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner was a  
7            prisoner of war;
- 8       (6)    The Pearl Harbor survivor plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner  
9            survived the attack at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii while serving on active duty;
- 10      (7)    The Gold Star plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner is a parent,  
11            spouse, sibling, or child of a member of the United States armed forces who died  
12            while serving this country on active duty or as a result of that service;
- 13      (8)    The Purple Heart plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner received the  
14            Purple Heart as a result of the owner's service;
- 15      (9)    The Medal of Honor plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner received  
16            the Medal of Honor, including a facsimile of the medallion portion corresponding to  
17            the branch of the United States armed forces for which the owner served when the  
18            medal was received, as a result of the owner's service;
- 19      (10)   The Silver Star plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner received the  
20            Silver Star as a result of the owner's service;
- 21      (11)   The Distinguished Service Cross plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the  
22            owner received the Distinguished Service Cross as a result of the owner's service;
- 23      (12)   The Navy Cross plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner received the  
24            Navy Cross as a result of the owner's service;

1 (13) The Air Force Cross plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner received  
2 the Air Force Cross as a result of the owner's service;

3 (14) The Distinguished Flying Cross plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner  
4 received the Distinguished Flying Cross as a result of the owner's service;

5 (15) The Bronze Star with Valor plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner  
6 received the Bronze Star with Valor as a result of the owner's service; and

7 (16) The Bronze Star plate shall contain a symbol indicating that the owner received the  
8 Bronze Star as a result of the owner's service.

9 Section 10. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
10 follows:

11 Military specialty plates shall be surrendered to the county treasurer of the owner's residence  
12 if the owner no longer qualifies for the plate. The county treasurer shall notify the secretary who  
13 shall make the necessary changes in the registration system. The military specialty plates may  
14 be retained by the owner's family upon the owner's death, but may not be displayed on any  
15 vehicle beyond the expiration of the military specialty plates or renewal decals. Failure to  
16 surrender the military specialty plates as required by this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.

17 Section 11. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
18 follows:

19 If the ownership of a motor vehicle with a military specialty plate is transferred or assigned,  
20 the transferor shall remove the military specialty plates from the vehicle and shall receive a  
21 credit for the unexpired time on the registration when the plates are attached to another vehicle.  
22 The county treasurer shall process a new registration indicating the motor vehicle to which the  
23 military specialty plates are to be transferred and send it to the department. The secretary shall  
24 make the necessary changes in the registration system and the credit shall be applied. The

1 department shall notify the transferor of any corrections which need to be made.

2 No credit may be issued if the military specialty plate is detached and not reattached to  
3 another motor vehicle. If the transferor fails to remove the military specialty plates pursuant to  
4 this section, the transferor is not entitled to any credit and the plates are no longer valid. A  
5 violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.

6 Section 12. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
7 follows:

8 If a motor vehicle with a military specialty plate is destroyed by collision or fire, disposed  
9 of for salvage, or if rejected or condemned for use on the highways as the result of action by any  
10 inspection authority of this state, the registered owner of the motor vehicle shall remove the  
11 military specialty plates from the vehicle and shall receive a credit for the unexpired time on the  
12 registration when the plates are attached to another vehicle. The county treasurer shall process  
13 a new registration indicating the motor vehicle to which the military specialty plates are to be  
14 transferred and send it to the department. The secretary shall make the necessary changes in the  
15 registration system and the credit shall be applied. The department shall notify the transferor of  
16 any corrections which need to be made. If the military specialty plates were destroyed, the owner  
17 shall apply for a replacement set of plates pursuant to section 14 of this Act.

18 No credit may be issued if the military specialty plate is detached and not reattached to  
19 another motor vehicle. If the owner fails to remove the military specialty plates pursuant to this  
20 section, the owner is not entitled to any credit and the plates are no longer valid. A violation of  
21 this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.

22 Section 13. That chapter 32-5 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as  
23 follows:

24 If any military specialty plate is lost, mutilated, or destroyed, the owner of the registered

1 vehicle may obtain a duplicate upon filing an affidavit showing such facts and after paying a ten  
2 dollar fee to the department. The fee shall be credited to the license plate special revenue fund.

3 Section 14. That § 32-5-67 be amended to read as follows:

4 32-5-67. All fees received pursuant to §§ 32-5-65 ~~and~~, 32-5-65.1, section 6, and section 7  
5 of this Act shall be credited to a fund to be known as the license plate special revenue fund. The  
6 special revenue fund shall be expended for the purchase of special plates required pursuant to  
7 this chapter and the expenses of the office incident to the issuance thereof. Disbursements from  
8 this fund shall be made by warrants drawn by the state auditor on vouchers duly approved by  
9 the secretary.

10 Section 15. That § 32-30-11.1 be amended to read as follows:

11 32-30-11.1. Any person with a physical disability, who displays special license plates issued  
12 under § 32-5-76 or ~~32-5-108~~ subdivision (2) of section 4 of this Act, a serially numbered  
13 certificate issued under § 32-5-76.1 or 32-5-76.2, or a similar license plate or certificate issued  
14 in another state on ~~an automobile~~ a motor vehicle used in transporting that person, shall be  
15 entitled to park without limitation in areas where parking is normally restricted by time factors  
16 and to park in any space reserved for a person with a disability. However, a municipality may,  
17 by ordinance, prohibit parking on any street or highway for the purpose of creating a fire lane,  
18 or to provide for the accommodation of heavy traffic during morning and afternoon rush hours.  
19 The privileges extended to persons with disabilities do not apply on streets or highways where  
20 and during any time parking is prohibited.

21 Section 16. That § 32-5-55 be repealed.

22 ~~32-5-55. Any owner of a motor vehicle, who is a resident of this state, who is a regularly~~  
23 ~~enlisted or commissioned member of the South Dakota National Guard, other than an inactive~~  
24 ~~member thereof, and who has complied with all of the laws of this state in relation to the~~

1 registration of a motor vehicle, may receive plates bearing a special number and design, and  
2 designating the person as a member or retired member of the South Dakota National Guard. The  
3 number plates shall be designed by the adjutant general and subject to the approval of the  
4 department. The special plates shall be displayed as set forth in § 32-5-98.

5 Section 17. That § 32-5-55.1 be repealed.

6 ~~—32-5-55.1. A retired member of the South Dakota National Guard with twenty years or more  
7 of creditable service is entitled to make application to the adjutant general and receive  
8 distinctive license plates as provided for in § 32-5-55, subject to the same limitations and  
9 conditions as are applicable to members of the active national guard.~~

10 Section 18. That § 32-5-56 be repealed.

11 ~~—32-5-56. Each person receiving national guard special number plates shall pay a ten dollar  
12 fee for the cost of producing the special number plates. All fees collected under this section shall  
13 be placed in the license plate special revenue fund, as provided under § 32-5-67.~~

14 Section 19. That § 32-5-56.1 be repealed.

15 ~~—32-5-56.1. The number plates authorized by § 32-5-55 shall be retained for the same period  
16 of time as plates referred to in § 32-5-83.~~

17 Section 20. That § 32-5-59 be repealed.

18 ~~—32-5-59. Each member of the South Dakota National Guard shall apply to the county  
19 treasurer of the county of residence for the issuance of special number plates for the motor  
20 vehicles owned by the member. The guard member, in order to receive the special plates, shall  
21 have paid the appropriate license fee for the registration of the vehicle.~~

22 Section 21. That § 32-5-61 be repealed.

23 ~~—32-5-61. A failure on the part of an active member of the South Dakota National Guard to  
24 make application to his unit commander for such special number plates as provided in § 32-5-57~~

1 will result in such member being required to accept regular number plates for his motor vehicle.

2 Section 22. That § 32-5-62 be repealed.

3 ~~—32-5-62. If any member of the South Dakota National Guard is discharged, separated, or~~  
4 ~~furloughed therefrom to a reserve or inactive status, the adjutant general shall, before relieving~~  
5 ~~the member, require the member to surrender the special number plates identifying him or her~~  
6 ~~as a member of the South Dakota National Guard. The special plates shall be surrendered to the~~  
7 ~~adjutant general who shall notify the secretary who shall make the necessary changes in the~~  
8 ~~registration file. The vehicle owner shall obtain regular number plates issued under § 32-5-55.~~

9 Section 23. That § 32-5-63 be repealed.

10 ~~—32-5-63. If at any time a motor vehicle subject to the special number plates issued for the~~  
11 ~~national guard shall be sold, conveyed, or otherwise transferred by the member or retired~~  
12 ~~member of the South Dakota National Guard to whom such special number plates have been~~  
13 ~~issued, the member shall notify the county treasurer of the county of residence. The county shall~~  
14 ~~process a new registration indicating the motor vehicle to which the special plates are to be~~  
15 ~~transferred and send it to the department. The secretary shall make the necessary changes in the~~  
16 ~~file. The department shall notify the applicant of any corrections which need to be made.~~

17 Section 24. That § 32-5-64 be repealed.

18 ~~—32-5-64. All statutes of this state relating to the registration of motor vehicles, and the titling~~  
19 ~~and licensing of motor vehicles, the fees for registering, titling, and licensing of motor vehicles,~~  
20 ~~and the retention of plates from year to year shall be applicable to members of the South Dakota~~  
21 ~~National Guard and the distinctive plates issued in conformity with § 32-5-55.~~

22 Section 25. That § 32-5-108 be repealed.

23 ~~—32-5-108. Any resident veteran owner of a motor vehicle who has received the United States~~  
24 ~~Veterans' Administration K Award, meets the qualifications established by Public Law 187 of~~

1 the Eighty-second Congress for a veteran to receive an automobile, or a veteran who has been  
2 rated as in receipt of a statutory benefit for loss or loss of use of one or more extremities, or a  
3 veteran who receives a veteran's allotment for a total service-connected disability, upon  
4 application to the department shall receive a maximum of two sets of special license plates for  
5 any automobile, pickup truck, or van licensed pursuant to § 32-5-5 or a motorcycle licensed  
6 pursuant to § 32-5-9. The veteran may choose to use one of the two sets of plates on a  
7 noncommercial motor vehicle that is a pickup truck and that weighs more than six thousand  
8 pounds licensed pursuant to § 32-5-6.3 or a motor home licensed pursuant to § 32-5-6.1. The  
9 veteran shall pay the regular license fees set out in §§ 32-5-6.3 and 32-5-6.1 and may not be  
10 required to pay the ten dollars for the special plates and renewal stickers. The special plates shall  
11 be displayed as set forth in § 32-5-98. The design of the license plate shall consist of a white  
12 background bordered on the left by a blue field with white stars and on the right by alternating  
13 red and white stripes. The words, Disabled Veteran, shall be inscribed on the plate in blue, in  
14 at least ten point bold type. The license plate shall be reflectorized and validated each year with  
15 a sticker in the same manner as a noncommercial license plate. License fees for the special  
16 plates shall be ten dollars for the plates and the renewal stickers. No license fee or sticker fee  
17 pursuant to § 32-5-6 or 32-5-9 may be charged to the veteran. The fees shall be deposited in the  
18 license plate special revenue fund.

19 — In order to qualify for a special license plate pursuant to this section, a veteran shall, in  
20 addition to meeting the qualifications established in the first paragraph, have incurred the  
21 disability while serving the United States in active duty during a time of war or while  
22 participating in a military mission involving armed conflict. If it is determined that the veteran  
23 owner does not qualify for the special plates or if the veteran owner dies, the plates shall be  
24 surrendered to the county treasurer of applicant's residence. The treasurer shall notify the

1 secretary who shall make the necessary changes in the registration file. Failure to surrender the  
2 special license plates as required by this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.

3 Section 26. That § 32-5-109 be repealed.

4 ~~— 32-5-109. Any resident of this state who was a prisoner of war while serving in the United  
5 States armed forces and who received an honorable discharge from the United States armed  
6 forces is eligible to apply to the secretary for a maximum of two sets special motor vehicle  
7 license plates if the resident has first complied with all laws of this state for any automobile,  
8 pickup truck, or van licensed pursuant to § 32-5-5 or a motorcycle licensed pursuant to § 32-5-9.  
9 The veteran may choose to use one of the two sets of plates on a noncommercial motor vehicle  
10 that is a pickup truck and that weighs more than six thousand pounds licensed pursuant to § 32-  
11 5-6.3 or a motor home licensed pursuant to § 32-5-6.1. The veteran shall pay the regular license  
12 fees set out in §§ 32-5-6.3 and 32-5-6.1 and may not be required to pay the ten dollars for the  
13 special plates and renewal stickers. Each application shall be on a form prescribed by the  
14 secretary and shall include certification of the applicant's prisoner of war status from the United  
15 States Veterans' Administration. The applicant shall pay a ten dollar fee and shall receive special  
16 plates. The special plates shall be displayed as set forth in § 32-5-98. A fee of ten dollars shall  
17 be paid for the renewal stickers. No registration fee or sticker fee may be charged to the  
18 applicant pursuant to § 32-5-6 or 32-5-9. The fees shall be deposited into the license plate  
19 special revenue fund. Upon approval of the application, the secretary shall issue the license  
20 plates which shall be numbered consecutively, beginning with the number 1, and the number  
21 shall be preceded by the letters POW. If it is determined that an applicant does not qualify for  
22 the special plates or if the applicant dies, the plates shall be surrendered to the county treasurer  
23 of the applicant's residence. The treasurer shall notify the secretary who shall make the  
24 necessary changes in the registration file. Failure to surrender the special license plates as~~

1 required by this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.

2 Section 27. That § 32-5-109.1 be repealed.

3 ~~—32-5-109.1. Any resident of this state who was serving in the United States armed forces and~~  
4 ~~survived the attack at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on December 7, 1941, and who received an~~  
5 ~~honorable discharge, may apply to the secretary for a maximum of two sets of special motor~~  
6 ~~vehicle license plates if the applicant has complied with all the laws of this state for any~~  
7 ~~automobile, pickup truck, or van licensed pursuant to § 32-5-5 or a motorcycle licensed pursuant~~  
8 ~~to § 32-5-9. The veteran may choose to use one of the two sets of plates on a noncommercial~~  
9 ~~motor vehicle that is a pickup truck and that weighs more than six thousand pounds licensed~~  
10 ~~pursuant to § 32-5-6.3 or a motor home licensed pursuant to § 32-5-6.1. The veteran shall pay~~  
11 ~~the regular license fees set out in §§ 32-5-6.3 and 32-5-6.1 and may not be required to pay the~~  
12 ~~ten dollars for the special plates and renewal stickers. Each application shall be on a form~~  
13 ~~prescribed by the secretary and shall include such information as the secretary may require. The~~  
14 ~~applicant shall pay a ten dollar fee and shall receive special plates. The special plates shall be~~  
15 ~~displayed as set forth in § 32-5-98. A fee of ten dollars shall be paid for the renewal stickers. No~~  
16 ~~registration fee or sticker fee may be charged to the applicant pursuant to § 32-5-6 or 32-5-9.~~
