1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to exempt certain purchases for law enforcement, fire
2 protection, and emergency medical and transport services from the general provisions
3 regarding procurement of public safety equipment for the state and its political subdivisions.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

5 Section 1. That § 5-18A-22 be amended to read as follows:

6 5-18A-22. The provisions of this chapter and chapters 5-18B, 5-18C, and 5-18D do not
7 apply to:

- 8 (1) Any highway construction contract entered into by the Department of Transportation;
- 9 (2) Any contract for the purchase of supplies from the United States or its agencies or
10 any contract issued by the General Services Administration;
- 11 (3) Any purchase of supplies or services, other than professional services, by purchasing
12 agencies from any active contract that has been awarded by any government entity
13 by competitive sealed bids or competitive sealed proposals or from any contract that
14 was competitively solicited and awarded within the previous twelve months;



- 1 (4) Any equipment repair contract;
- 2 (5) Any procurement of electric power, water, or natural gas; chemical and biological
3 products; laboratory apparatus and appliances; published books, maps, periodicals
4 and technical pamphlets; works of art for museum and public display; medical
5 supplies; communications technologies, computer hardware and software, peripheral
6 equipment, and related connectivity; tableware or perishable foods;
- 7 (6) Any supplies, services, and professional services required for externally funded
8 research projects at institutions under the control of the Board of Regents;
- 9 (7) Any property or liability insurance or performance bonds, except that the actual
10 procurement of any insurance or performance bonds by any department of the state
11 government, state institution, and state agency shall be made under the supervision
12 of the Bureau of Administration;
- 13 (8) Any supplies needed by the Department of Human Services or the Department of
14 Social Services or prison industries for the manufacturing of products;
- 15 (9) Any printing involving student activities, conducted by student organizations and
16 paid for out of student fees, at institutions under the control of the Board of Regents.
17 However, nothing in this subdivision exempts, from the requirements of this chapter
18 and chapters 5-18B, 5-18C, and 5-18D, purchases that involve printing for other
19 activities at institutions under the control of the Board of Regents;
- 20 (10) Any purchase of surplus property from another purchasing agency;
- 21 (11) Any animals purchased;
- 22 (12) Any purchase by a school district of perishable food, raw materials used in
23 construction or manufacture of products for resale, or for transportation of students;
- 24 (13) Any authority authorized by chapters 1-16A, 1-16B, 1-16E, 1-16G, 1-16H, 1-16J, 5-

- 1 12, or 11-11;
- 2 (14) Any seeds, fertilizers, herbicides, pesticides, feeds, and supplies used in the operation
- 3 of farms by institutions under the control of the Board of Regents;
- 4 (15) Any purchase of supplies for any utility owned or operated by a municipality if the
- 5 purchase does not exceed the limits established in § 5-18A-14;
- 6 (16) For political subdivisions, any contract for asbestos removal in emergency response
- 7 actions and any contract for services provided by individuals or firms for consultants,
- 8 audits, legal services, ambulance services, architectural services and engineering,
- 9 insurance, real estate services, or auction services; ~~or~~
- 10 (17) Any purchase of supplies or services from a contract established through a
- 11 Midwestern Higher Education Compact group purchasing program by a competitive
- 12 sealed bid or a competitive sealed proposal;
- 13 (18) Any weapons, protective equipment, or tactical equipment for any public law
- 14 enforcement agency; or
- 15 (19) Any motor vehicles used for law enforcement, fighting fires, or providing initial
- 16 emergency medical and transport services.
