MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS

- HCR 1015 (HJ 15<sup>th</sup> LD; Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) In support of protecting American sovereignty and defending individual second amendment rights from United Nations interference.
- HCR 1017 (HJ 16<sup>th</sup> LD) Urging Congress, the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP), the United States Department of Justice, and the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) to recognize industrial hemp as a valuable agricultural commodity.
- SCR 1 (SJ 14<sup>th</sup> LD) Urging Congress to reject the proposal to remove the states' authority to designate a hospital as a necessary provider under the critical access hospital program.

- HB 1199 repeal certain outdated and obsolete provisions regarding family law.

## SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

- HB 1171 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) revise provisions relating to trespass associated with hunting, fishing, or trapping.
- HB 1071 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) change the procedure for a minor boundary change.
- HB 1143\* (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) repeal certain provisions regarding unemployment insurance benefit eligibility of workers attending approved training.
- HB 1158 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) provide medical care for certain unborn children.
- HB 1180 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) provide that no entity that places children for adoption or performs abortions may be registered as a pregnancy help center.
- HB 1130 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) authorize the use of crossbows for hunting big game animals during the firearm season.
- HB 1133 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) repeal or revise certain provisions concerning townships.
- HB 1232 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) clarify certain provisions relating to the issuance of permits for outdoor advertising signs, displays, or devices.
- HB 1083\* restrict the term of conservation easements.
- HB 1136 limit the authority of delegates to a limited Article V convention to vote for unauthorized amendments contrary to legislative instructions and to provide a civil fine for the violation thereof.
- HB 1201 revise the bank franchise tax apportionment of income provisions.
- HB 1154 authorize the commissioner of school and public lands to grant certain surface and subsurface easements to provide access to oil, gas, minerals, and geothermal resources.
- HB 1169 protect certain homestead exemption interests during sale of homestead or separation of owners.
- HB 1111 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) revise certain provisions related to the design, construction, and equipping of a veterans home near Hot Springs, to make an appropriation therefor, and to declare an emergency.

## SECOND READING OF SENATE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

- SB 12 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) update references to certain federal motor carrier regulations.
- SB 64 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) require a waiting period prior to the adoption of new uniform content standards and to provide for an opportunity for public comment for all new content standards.
- SB 55 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) repeal the contractor's excise tax on certain new or expanded power production facilities.
- SB 34 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) revise certain provisions concerning applications for absentee ballot and to declare an emergency.
- SB 35 (Deferred from 16<sup>th</sup> LD) revise the conditions for which certain elections may be delayed for an emergency situation and to declare an emergency.

- SB 27 make an appropriation from the coordinated natural resources conservation fund to the State Conservation Commission and to declare an emergency.
- SB 31 make an appropriation to reimburse certain family physicians who have complied with the requirements of the recruitment assistance program and to declare an emergency.
- SB 32 revise previous appropriations for National Guard armory construction, to make an appropriation for a land purchase adjacent to the Watertown armory, and to declare an emergency.
