





FY16 Budget Hearing




FY2016 State General Fund Budget





Fatal Free 46

- In 2013, SD Highway 46 in southeast SD (Iowa to Pickstown) was recognized as a high crash area.
- In 2014, the Vermillion and Mitchell squads focused their efforts on reducing crashes in that area.

3/16/13 – 3/15/14

- 6 fatalities
- 22 injuries
- 56 non-injury crashes
- \$636,440 in property damage
- 321 citations issued
- 536 warnings issued

3/16/14 – 12/15/14

- 1 fatality
- 15 injuries
- 46 non-injury crashes
- \$267,816 in property damage
- 717 citations issued
- 1,096 warnings issued

Results:

83% reduction in fatal crashes

I-90 Aggressive Driver Campaign

- In 2014, the SD Highway Patrol launched a focused enforcement campaign to reduce crashes on I-90 between mm 32 and 52 in western SD during peak times.
- The campaign began on July 1 and concluded on September 30, 2014.

7/1/13 – 9/30/13

- 224 traffic stops
- 59 speeding citations
- 10 seatbelt citations
- 13 hazardous moving citations

7/1/14 – 9/30/14

- 498 traffic stops
- 171 speeding citations
- 24 seatbelt citations
- 20 hazardous moving citations

Results:

50% reduction in injury crashes
45% reduction in non-injury crashes.

Consolidated Dispatch Services: Effective, Cost-saving

State Radio Communications (SRC)

- Pierre SRC and Hughes County 911 consolidated in July 2014.
- Rapid City SRC will consolidate with Pennington County 911 in May 2015.

Cost Savings

FY14 Pierre SRC actual operating costs: \$449,616

2015 projected costs for CSDCC: - \$401,724

\$47,892 / 11%





Office of Emergency Management coordinated responses to flooding in Butte, Lincoln and Union Counties and a tornado in Wessington Springs. The subsequent damage resulted in a presidential disaster declaration.



2014 Disaster Quick Facts

- 12 counties declared disaster areas
- \$12 million FEMA-eligible
- 155 homes destroyed or damaged
- 400+ state personnel deployed to assist
- 30+ pieces of state equipment deployed

75th Annual Sturgis Motorcycle Rally Operations Center (ROC)

Update on 75th Rally activities:

- Third year of planning at the state level.
- ROC will coordinate information and resources daily and in an emergency
- Provide rapid-response with resources and support in the event of a major incident during the Rally.
- On February 18, 2015, 132 public safety officials from 60 different city, county, state, and federal agencies participated in a tabletop exercise to prepare for the Rally.



State Fire Marshal

- According to National Fire Incident Reporting System data, South Dakota reported the lowest number of fire deaths since reporting began in 1998.
 - 1999: 13
 - 2014: 6
- Zero firefighter fatalities in 2014.
- Partnering with local fire departments and the insurance industry to place smoke detectors in at-risk homes.




Emergency Medical Services

- Hardship exemptions, unfortunately, are increasing. Out of 123 ground services, 28 have a hardship exemption.
- EMT testing has been streamlined. Ambulance services can schedule a class anytime and conduct testing locally.
- Transitioning to the Department of Health – we will miss them at DPS!



Additional Homeland Security Projects

Active Shooter Exercise

- The Office of Homeland Security, in conjunction with several local, county, and state agencies in the Pierre area, held an active shooter exercise for the state Capitol building in January 2014.
- The exercise was a simulation of an active shooter in the Capitol building and the response from federal, state and local law enforcement agencies, emergency management, fire departments and healthcare. Approximately 60 state employees participated in the exercise.



In 2014, the Office:


- supported 191 local and 18 state projects.
- supported five trainings for Special Weapons and Tactical (SWAT) teams across the state including advanced SWAT, hostage rescue, grenadier, sniper, and command decision training.
- issued 746 bulletins and received and processed 1,098 requests for information through the Fusion Center.

In 2014, Driver Licensing processed 677 online applications for renewals and duplicates.


Taking the wait out of Driver Licensing

- **Summer of 2012:** 1 out of 10 people served in 10 minutes or less – **7.3%**
- **Summer of 2013:** 4 out of 10 people served in 10 minutes or less – **44.2%**
- **Summer of 2014:** 8 out of 10 people served in 10 minutes or less – **63.9%**
- **Currently:** 7 out of 10 people served in 10 minutes or less – **74.5%**




D.I.Y. DL Update

- Kiosks are located at the Sioux Falls, Rapid City, Aberdeen, Watertown, Pierre and Brookings exam stations.
- 5,879 kiosk transactions in 2014.
- Applicant begins process at kiosk and completes process with examiner. Each customer spends less time in line, and each examiner serves more customers.




Driver Licensing – REAL ID Update

- As of Feb. 1, 2015, 610,326 South Dakotans hold federally compliant cards.
- That is more than 98 percent of the 620,353 licensed drivers in the State.
- Currently, 21 states, including South Dakota, have met the REAL ID Act requirements and 25 have been given a compliance extension to Oct. 10, 2015.




State Inspection Program

The State Inspection Program provides field inspection services for a variety of state agencies and departments including Health, Lottery, Fire Marshal, Agriculture, Education, Social Services and Weights and Measures.



Inspections (cont.)

Inspectors verify safety and compliance in a variety of areas, including food, lodging, lottery, school fire and life safety, bulk pesticide, eggs, corn borer, feed mill, school lunch, daycare, fuel pumps and meters, scales and bulk LP (liquid petroleum).



Weights and Measures

- The Weights and Measures Program's mission is to verify that commercial weighing and measuring devices are true and accurate.
- Gas pumps in the state are examined every other year by inspectors.
- The work of the program strengthens consumer confidence in commerce, allowing South Dakota businesses to compete fairly at home and abroad and strengthening the economies of both the state and the United States.



9-1-1 Coordination Board

The 9-1-1 service in South Dakota is provided by 33 local public safety answering points, with 18 county-run, 10 city-run, one independent and four tribal answering points.

SB 174 in the 2012 legislative session increased the 9-1-1 surcharge. This increased surcharge is now funding contracts that are in place to begin the construction of Next Generation 9-1-1 in South Dakota. In early May of 2015, Pennington County will be the first PSAP on the new statewide hosted phone system.



NextGen 911 will:

- Interconnect the 9-1-1 centers to greatly improve interoperability and the routing of emergency calls.
- Make 9-1-1 services less prone to outages and failures due to the high levels of geo-diversity and redundancy built into the system.
- Eventually allow citizens to share pictures and video with 9-1-1 centers during a 9-1-1 call and communicate with the 9-1-1 center via text message.
