

# Administration

## **Federal fund authority reduction:**

- Decrease of \$150,000 in federal fund authority that is no longer needed

## Licensure & Certification

- 2.0 FTE and \$159,645 general fund expansion
- Last time this program received additional FTE was prior to 2003
- Expansion needed to survey ALC's annually
  - Number of ALC beds is growing and continues to grow
  - Other licensure workload also continues to grow




### Facilities



- *Estimated\**
- *Trend – Small facilities with few beds closing. Larger facilities with more beds opening.*
- *Facilities include: hospitals, critical access hospitals, nursing facilities, adult foster care, assisted living centers, residential living centers, abortion facilities, ambulatory surgery centers, chemical dependency treatment facilities, end stage renal dialysis facilities, home health agencies, hospice agencies, ICF/MRs, inpatient hospice facilities, residential hospice facilities, outpatient physical occupational therapy, psychiatric residential treatment facility, and rural health clinics.*

- *Beds includes: hospitals, critical access hospitals, nursing facilities, adult foster care, and assisted living centers*

# Health Systems Development & Regulation Recruitment Assistance Program (RAP)

- \$518,600 general fund expansion to reimburse participants who have successfully fulfilled their practice obligation

- Special appropriation since at least 2001
- General fund expansion to base budget

# Health Systems Development & Regulation

## Rural Health Facility Recruitment Assistance Program (RHFRAP)

- RHFRAP created in FY13 to assist rural health care facilities in recruiting nurses, dietitians/nutritionists, pharmacists, etc. by providing a recruitment incentive payment (matched by the local facility) to health professionals who have completed the 3-year practice obligation.
- \$277,500 general fund expansion for 40 health professionals who are eligible for payment in FY17

# Health Systems Development & Regulation

## Health Protection Inspections

- \$5,913 general fund increase due to an increase in the inspection rate

# Family & Community Health

## Immunization billing system:

- Decrease of \$80,000 general funds for the Immunization billing system
  - 2016 Budget: \$150,000
    - Development, licensing, credentialing, maintenance, and IT support of billing system
  - Projection 2017
    - Billing System Infrastructure, Licensing and Credentialing will be complete:  
\$80,000
    - Ongoing Need for System: Maintenance, Customization & IT Support:  
\$70,000

## Federal fund authority reduction:

- Decrease of \$1,500,000 in federal fund authority that is no longer needed
