NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Social Services: (February 18, 2009) intends to amend Medical Services Program rules to revise terminology; specify requirements and limitations of covered transportation services; move certain fee schedules to the Department's website and establish a system under which a provider can request an amendment to the schedules; update rates of payment for covered transportation services; and establish criteria for reimbursement of covered transportation services; amend Child Protection Services Program rules to establish water safety standards for family foster homes and require a group care center provider to submit its building plans for review; and amend LIEAP Program rules to remove the maximum payment limit for repair of a household's heating system. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 26-6-16, 28-1-50, and 28-6-1.

A public hearing will be held in Conference Room #2, Kneip Office Building, 700 Governors Drive, Pierre, South Dakota, on March 17, 2009, at 9:00 a.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to Laura Ringling, Administrative Rules, Department of Social Services, 700 Governors Drive, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. Ms. Ringling may be contacted by telephone at (605) 773-3165. Written comments must be received by March 27, 2009, to be considered. Individuals intending to present oral testimony at the hearing must make a written copy of their testimony available to the

department at the time of the hearing. The testimony must relate directly to the changes being proposed and must cite the specific rule number to which the comments are being directed. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place. Persons who have special needs for which the department can make arrangements are asked to call (605) 773-3165 at least 48 hours before the hearing.

Department of Education: Board of Education: (February 20, 2009) intends to adopt and amend Ed Resources rules to require schools to submit a plan if they do not meet their annual measurable objective specific to highly qualified teachers for three consecutive years and increase fees for teachers who apply for initial or for renewing a teacher certificate; and amend an Administration rule to require districts to verify the final submission of data on the second Friday in June and eliminate the additional seven days for districts that are greater than 5000 students for the June reporting deadline. No authority was cited by the board for the Highly Qualified Teacher Improvement Plan rules. The general authority for the other rules, as cited by the board, is 13-1-12.1, 13-13-37.4, and 13-42-3.

Department of Health: Health and Medical Services: (February 20, 2009) intends to amend a rule to ensure that Children's Special Health Services (CSHS) is using the current poverty guidelines in determining financial assistance eligibility. The general authority for this rule, as cited by the department, is SDCL 34-1-21.

A public hearing will be held in the Hayes Building, Room 107, 600 East Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on March 30, 2009, at 9:30 a.m. Copies of the proposed rule may be obtained without charge from and written comments sent to the South Dakota Department of Health, 600 East Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. 2-26-2009	Transportation	Amend a speed zone in Brown County on US Highway 12 in the City of Aberdeen to reduce the speed limits on a segment of highway near the east part of the city; amend a speed zone in Gregory County on US Highway 18 in the City of Gregory to reduce the speed limits on a segment of highway near the west edge of the city; and adopt a rule to prohibit parking along both sides of State Highway 19 in Clay County along the shoulder of the road north of the Missouri River bridge; 35 SDR 189.
3-5-2009	Game, Fish and Parks	Amend a Uses of Parks and Public Lands rule to remove the reference to "historic relics" in ARSD 41:03:01:15 (which with certain exceptions prohibits the destruction or removal

		<p>of natural or historic features from lands controlled by the department) and replace it with "cultural resources" and establish a definition for "cultural resources;" amend a Markings and Zones rule to require authorization of the department secretary prior to any person placing buoys on public waters; amend Public Water Zoning rules to establish a no wake zone on Lake Francis Case adjacent to South Shore Lakeside Use Area (Gregory County); modify the boundaries of the no wake zone at Spring Creek Recreation Area (Hughes County) and establish a no swimming zone for the same area; amend the duration of the no wake zone on Long Lake (Lake County); establish a no wake zone within the waters of Cedar Shores marina on Lake Francis Case (Lyman County); and re-establish and maintain two public water safety zones on Pactola Lake (specifically, Musekamp Draw, also known as Airplane Draw, and Boarding House Gulch) in Pennington County, that were repealed by the GFP Commission in 2008; amend Motorboats and Watercraft rules to require mandatory use of a personal flotation device by a child age 12 or younger on board a boat operated at greater than no-wake speed unless the child is within a cabin or below deck, and add a provision to the rule that would require any person engaged in a watersport to wear a personal flotation device while so engaged; amend Refuges rules to move the western boundary for the Sutton Bottom and Latin Draw Waterfowl Refuges on the Missouri River from the water's edge to the center of the reservoir, and change Antelope Lake State Game Bird Refuge in Clark County to a State Waterfowl Refuge; amend Bait rules to amend ARSD 41:09:04:02 by replacing the word "fishers" with "anglers," delete "and biological specimens" and add "from the waters of the state;" change the title of ARSD 41:09:04:02.02 and define the species that can be taken and sold as bait by commercial bait dealers and delete biological specimens from the rule; amend ARSD 41:09:04:03 by deleting "and biological specimens," make minor revisions to the text for purposes of clarity, add East Krause, Middle Lynn (both in Day</p>
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	<p>County) and Lake Alice (Deuel County) to the list of waters closed to commercial take of bait, remove Belvidere and Freeman (Jackson County) and Okaton (Jones County) from the list of waters closed year-round to the commercial taking of bait, and delete that portion of the rule that allows commercial take of mollusks by special permit from the secretary; amend ARSD 41:09:04:04 to clearly separate and define the gear allowed for commercial and noncommercial use, allow the department secretary or a designee to approve special equipment requests, add language clarifying that the bait possession limits do not apply to bait purchased from a licensed bait dealer, and make minor revisions to the text of the rule; delete "rough fish to be destroyed" from the title of ARSD 41:09:04:07, make minor revisions to the text of the rule for purposes of clarity, including specifying that game fish and threatened and endangered species caught in bait traps be returned to the water as soon as possible to prevent stress and death, and allow rough fist to be destroyed but not make it mandatory to do so; amend ARSD 41:09:04:09 to add "and gill-breathing animals" to the existing text; amend ARSD 41:09:04:12 to add language allowing a bait dealer with a private hatchery license to transport other fish while transporting baitfish under certain conditions; amend ARSD 41:09:04:13 by adding "and frogs" to the rule title and deleting the portion that allows the department secretary to approve the importation of reptiles, amphibians, crustaceans and mollusks for private introduction, culture or commercial purposes; amend both the title and text of ARSD 41:09:04:14 to clarify that the rules applies to "bait dealers" as opposed to simply "dealer," amend ARSD 41:09:04:15 pertaining to identification required on bait dealers vehicles and tanks used in transporting bait to decrease the size of lettering required, remove the requirement that the bait dealer's complete address be displayed, and require that the "bait" be included as part of the identification (if "bait" is part of the business name of the</p>
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		dealer the requirement would be satisfied); amend ARSD 41:09:04:16 to specify that the records required in this section shall be recorded and maintained on forms provided by the department, specify the records required for each type of bait dealer license, require that records be kept current and available for inspection during normal business hours, require that records be kept for a period of three years after the end of the license year, and require that a summary or records be submitted by January 31 of the year immediately following the licensed year, regardless of whether a renewal of the bait license is requested; and amend both the title and text of ARSD 41:09:04:17 to clarify that a conviction for violating the bait dealer rules by a licensee or his agents and employees may be cause for immediate revocation of the bait dealer's current license and for the department's refusal to issue a license for the calendar year following the year of conviction; 35 SDR 197.
