**NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES:** (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council)

**Department of Commerce and Regulation: Commission on Gaming:** (February 19, 2003) is proposing rules to more accurately reflect a true and adequate cash requirement for bankroll calculations; set up new rules for the variation of play for Lucky Ladies Blackjack and Progressive Blackjack; eliminate Derek J. Webb as the owner of the rights of three-card poker; change the top payout hand for five aces to 500 to 1 odds for Phil'em Up Poker; adopt variations of poker known as Twisted Pineapple Poker and Texas Shootout Poker; clarify the minimum bankroll calculations and accurately reflect true and adequate cash requirements; and to help the Commission's Operations Division and the auditing process by giving more supporting documentation that the correct gaming tax has been submitted. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the Commission, is 42-7B-7 and 42-7B-32.

A public hearing will be held at City Hall, 102 Sherman Street, Deadwood, South Dakota, on

Friday, March 14, 2003, at 9:00 a.m. MST. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained without charge from and written comments sent to the South Dakota Commission on Gaming, 118 West Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501-2071. Written comments must be received by March 12, 2003, to be considered. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place.
