NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Social Services: (April 7, 2008) has filed a rule amendment to increase the Supplemental Security Income (SSI) standard benefit amount.

This rule is adopted under the procedure provided in SDCL 1-36-20. This procedure permits adoption of a federally mandated rule without following the procedures set forth in SDCL 1-26-4 to 1-26-6, inclusive.

Department of Social Services: (April 7, 2008) has filed rule amendments to increase, as of January 1, the maximum amount of resources that may be protected for the community spouse and the maximum amount of the monthly maintenance needs allowance for the community spouse when that person's spouse enters a long-term care facility.

These rules are adopted under the procedure provided in SDCL 1-36-20. This procedure permits adoption of a federally mandated rule without following the procedures set forth in SDCL 1-26-4 to 1-26-6, inclusive.

Department of Social Services: Medical Services: (April 10, 2008) intends to amend rules to incorporate by reference the latest federal poverty levels established by the United States Department of Health and Human Services; incorporate by reference the latest versions of the Physicians' Current Procedural Terminology (cpt), the International Classification of Diseases, 9th Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-9-CMP), and the CMS

Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS) manuals; specify that it is the individual's responsibility to provide the Department with the information necessary to determine initial or continuing eligibility and that failure to do so results in denial of an application or termination of current benefits; and update an internal reference. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 25-4-45.3, 28-1-61, 28-6-1, 28-6A-12, 28-7A-3, and 28-7A-24.

A public hearing will be held in Conference Room #2, Kneip Office Building, 700 Governors Drive, Pierre, South Dakota, on May 6, 2008, at 9:00 a.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to Jill Wellhouse, Administrative Rules, Department of Social Services, 700 Governors Drive, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. Ms. Wellhouse may be contacted by telephone at (605) 773-3305. Written comments must be received by May 16, 2008, to be considered. Individuals intending to present oral testimony at the hearing must make a written copy of their testimony available to the department at the time of the hearing. The testimony must relate directly to the changes being proposed and must cite the specific rule number to which the comments are being directed. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place. Persons who have special needs for which the department can make arrangements are asked to call (605) 773-3305 at least 48 hours before the hearing.

Department of Game, Fish and Parks: (April 10, 2008) intends to amend a Uses of Parks and Public Lands rule to allow deer

hunting to take place from October 1 to January 31 in all state parks, recreation areas, and nature areas during established hunting seasons according to provisions and restrictions set forth in ARSD 41:03:01:16, and allow only bow and arrow to be utilized at Clay County Recreation Area; amend Archery Restrictions to restrict persons hunting with bow and arrow from using or possessing lighted sight pins; amend Waterfowl Hunting Seasons rules to establish season dates for Units CGW-11A and NRW-11A (both units located in Bennett County), shooting hours, and daily bag and possession limits; and adjust the season dates to begin on the third Saturday of October for 65 consecutive days (October 18-December 21, 2008); amend an Archery Deer Hunting Season rule to establish season dates, number and types of available licenses, requirements and restrictions, open area, and shooting hours; and repeal the provisions in subsection (5) of ARSD 41:06:22:02 which provides that the archery deer hunting season in state parks, state recreation areas, and state nature areas are open beginning on October 1 and remain open until December 31, inclusive; amend an Archery Antelope Hunting Season rule to establish season dates, number and types of available licenses, requirements and restrictions, open area, and shooting hours; and add Hand County as an area open to archery antelope hunting; amend Youth Deer Hunting Season rules to establish season dates, numbers of available single tag "any antlerless deer" licenses, requirements and restrictions, open areas, and shooting hours; adjust the season length so that it runs continuously from the second Saturday of September through January 31; adjust the age requirement to allow youth who have not turned 18 (currently 16) by June 30 to purchase a license; adjust the application requirement to allow a resident parent or legal guardian to purchase a Youth Deer license for a designated mentored youth; allow archery hunters to hunt without wearing fluorescent orange; and require that mentored youth must be at least 10 and younger than 16 years of age; and amend a General Muzzleloading Deer Hunting Season

rule to establish season dates, number of available "any deer" and "any antlerless deer" licenses, requirements and restrictions, open area, and shooting hours; adjust the number of "any deer" licenses available only to residents from 400 to 1,000 licenses. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 41-2-18, 41-6-18.2, 41-6-18.4, 41-6-21, 41-11-5, and 41-17-1.1.

A public hearing will be held at the State Game Lodge located in Custer State Park, 13389 U.S. Highway 16A, Custer, South Dakota, on May 1, 2008, at 2:00 p.m. (MDT). Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to Jeffrey R. Vonk, Secretary, Foss Building, 523 East Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. Written comments must be received by and in the office of the Secretary of the Department of Game, Fish and Parks on or before 12:00 Noon three (3) days prior to the date of the hearing to be included within the record of the public hearing and to be considered by the Commission. Comments may also be sent by E-mail to chuck.schlueter@state.sd.us. All written and e-mail comments must include the commenter's name and address.
