NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Revenue and Regulation: South Dakota Lottery Commission: (April 19, 2010) intends to amend rules to authorize the Lottery upon initial application to license retailers to sell both on-line and instant tickets by taking advantage of technology that is now available to the Lottery with the new online gaming system and related products and service contract, to set the fees for on-line and instant license applications and annual license renewal, to set communications fees retailers licensed after July 1, 2010 will be required to pay, and to set sales benchmarks for retailers to meet to obtain a credit for the communications fees. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the commission, is SDCL 42-7A-4, 42-7A-11, 42-7A-19.1, 42-7A-21, and 42-7A-49.

Executive Order:

The Governor has signed **Executive Order
 2010-10** dated April 23, 2010. This executive
 order creates a workgroup to provide
 recommendations for the State Energy Program.
 Under the American Recovery and Renewal Act
 of 2009 the state and local governments are
 required to adopt building and energy codes that
 meet certain standards required by the Act. The
 workgroup has fifteen members to be appointed
 by several interested parties such as the Home
 Builders Association, the Municipal League, the
 County Commissioners Association and the
 Electrical and Plumbing Commissions, among
 others. The workgroup will meet three or four
 times this year and report its recommendations
 to the Governor before December 1, 2010.
