NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Education: Board of Education: (April 22, 2008) intends to amend rules to change submission dates of scholarship application from May 1 of each year to the third Friday in March to accommodate school events; delete the "or the equivalent on a weighted scale" to eliminate an advantage for some students with access to Advanced Placement courses to obtaining a weighted grade point average of over 4.0; eliminate "High" in Virtual High School; add an electronic delivery necessity unless an exemption is made by the Secretary of Education and to have courses identified as a need by South Dakota Virtual School Advisory Council; add another factor to be considered by the oversight board when reviewing a school district's request for exemption; remove an administrative rule; define terms for appointed board members; better prepare a student for creating a personal learning plan; change the giving of aptitude assessment to a more relevant time; allow individuals with less than a bachelors degree to gain a SD certificate to teach specific career and technical education course; and provide clarity on the Birth to Three Connections program and revise the fee schedule for providers. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the board, is 13-1-12.1, 13-3-47, 13-13-37.4, 13-14-1, 13-33-22, 13-37-1.1, and 13-42-3.

Department of Revenue and Regulation: Banking Commission: (April 23, 2008) has filed rules to repeal and amend the rules to reflect changes required by the passage of Senate Bill 17 in the 2008 Legislative session. The rule changes will no longer require banks to charge off fifty percent of all assets classified as doubtful; update the requirements on banks regarding their allowance for loan and lease losses; allow loan application decisions to be made at a loan production office; make references to responsible parties consistent for mortgage lending entity applicants; provide for an application process to reflect a change in control of a mortgage licensee without requiring an original application; provide for the bonding of mortgage brokerages; include copies of appraisals in the list of required records for each mortgage loan application file; update language regarding approved training courses and require the division to display a list of approved training providers and courses on its website; specify the records that must be maintained by money lenders licensed pursant to SDCL chapter 54-4; and update the fees authorized for money transmitters. The general authority for these

rules, as cited by the commission, is SDCL 51A-2-13, 51A-2-14, 51A-4-31, 51A-4-32, 51A-4-33, 51A-4-34, 51A-7-3, 51A-7-16, 51A-16-9, 51A-17-19, 54-4-38, 54-14-31, 54-14-14, 54-14-16, 54-14-26, and 54-14-31.
