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**NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES:** (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

***Department of Transportation:*** (April 30, 2009) is proposing to amend a speed zone in Beadle County on State Trunk Highway 28 in the City of Hitchcock to reduce the speed limits on a segment of highway near the east edge of the city; amend a speed zone in Buffalo County in the City of Fort Thompson to provide for a reduced speed limit along South Dakota Highway 47 southwest of the junction with South Dakota Highway 249; amend a speed zone in Buffalo County in the City of Fort Thompson to correct the highway number and to clarify the rule; amend a speed zone in Buffalo County at the City of Fort Thompson to provide for a reduced speed limit along South Dakota Highway 34 north of the junction with State Highway 47; amend a speed zone in Buffalo County in the City of Fort Thompson to provide for a reduced speed limit along South Dakota Highway 249 northeast of the junction with South Dakota Highway 47; amend a speed zone in Walworth County on US Highway 12 in the City of Mobridge to reduce the speed limits on a segment of highway near the business section of town; and amend a speed zone in Todd County on US Highway 18 and US Highway 83 in the City of Mission to reduce the speed limits on a segment of highway at the west edge of town. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 32-25-7 and 32-25-7.1.

A public hearing will be held in the Commission Room of the Becker Hansen Building, 700 East Broadway Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on May 28, 2009, at 9:05 a.m. CDST. Copies of the

***Department of Environment and Natural Resources: Board of Water and Natural Resources:*** (April 30, 2009) intends to adopt rules to establish a system for awarding funding provided to the State Revolving Fund programs by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, to allow the waiver of a financial status summary for certain applications, and to modify the deadline for forfeiture of principal forgiveness. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is 46A-1-60.3.
