**Department of Commerce and Regulation:**  
**Division of Insurance:** (May 7, 2002) is proposing rules to allow South Dakota insurers writing bail bonds to deviate from certain accounting requirements and to correct an error. The general authority for this rule, as cited by the division, is SDCL 58-6-75.

A public hearing will be held in the First Floor Conference Room of the Commerce Building, 118 West Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on May 28, 2002, at 9:00 a.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to the South Dakota Division of Insurance, 118 West Capitol Avenue, Pierre South Dakota 57501-2000.
