NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Tourism: State Historical Society: (May 7, 2012) intends to amend rules to set standard fees for services provided by the State Historical Society; revise the State Historic Preservation Office's review and handling of property tax moratorium applications; and alter when recipients of Deadwood Fund preservation grants from the State Historic Preservation Office must file the required preservation covenant for the grant. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL §§ 1-18-31.2, 1-19A-5, 1-19A-13.5, 1-19A-29, and 1-20-21.1.

A public hearing will be held at 9:00 a.m. (CST) on September 7, 2012, at the Cultural Heritage Center, 900 Governors Drive, Pierre, South Dakota. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained without charge from and written comments sent to the South Dakota State Historical Society, 900 Governors Drive, Pierre, South Dakota 57501-2217. Written comments must be received by September 6, 2012, to be considered. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place. Department of Health: Health Systems Development and Regulation: (May 8, 2012) intends to repeal the health professional recruitment incentive program rules and adopt rules to establish a program to assist rural health care facilities in the recruitment of certain health care professionals. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL §§ 1-16A-73.13, 1-16A-73.18, 34-12G-12, and 34-12G-15.

Department of Transportation: Aeronautics Commission: (May 10, 2012) is proposing to amend rules to eliminate a definition for "private commercial airport," add a definition for "publicly owned airport," and revise the definitions of "public airport" and "private airport;" clarify the requirement concerning licensing or approval by the Aeronautics Commission of public airports and any private airport, landing field, or heliport located within two miles of the nearest boundary of any other approved airport; and repeal a rule which sets minimum requirements for private commercial airports. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL § 50-2-2.1.

A public hearing will be held in the Commission Room of the Becker Hansen Building, 700 East Broadway Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on June 26, 2012, at 1:00 p.m. CDT.
