JOINT POWERS AGREEMENTS ON FILE WITH THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COUNCIL:

The **State of South Dakota** and the **Crow Creek Sioux Tribe** have entered into a joint powers agreement. The agreement outlines the duties and responsibilities regarding the State's and the Tribe's cooperative efforts to cleanup and replace the dormitory and classrooms that were damaged by the fire at the school at Stephan, SD.

The **South Dakota Department of Agriculture** and **Custer State Park** have entered into a series of agreements and grants regarding their attempts to retard the spread of mountain pine beetle within the park.

Copies of the above agreements are on file with the Legislative Research Council and may be reviewed or copied during usual business hours.
