FILINGS IN THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COUNCIL'S OFFICE:

Notice of Proposed Rules: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Social Services: (July 7, 2016) intends to amend Economic Assistance, Child Care Services, Medical Services, and Behavioral Health rules to update certain rules to reflect annual changes, update terminology to align with current practice, implement the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act requirements, repeal duplicative rules, and implement Medicaid coverage groups added by the 2016 legislative session. Article 46:05 Substance use disorders is re-written as Article 67:61 under the department. Article 46:20 Mental health is repealed and re-written as Article 67:62. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL §§ 1-36-25, 25-4-45.3, 26-6-16, 27A-1-9, 27A-5-1, 28-1-50, 28-1-61, 28-6-1, 28-6-1.1, 28-6-3.1, 28-6-18, 28-6A-12, 28-7A-3, 28-7A-24, and 34-20A-27.

A public hearing will be held in the Kneip Conference Room 1, Kneip Office Building, 700 Governors Drive, Pierre, South Dakota, on August 1, 2016, at 10:00 a.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to Teresa Schulte, Department of Social Services, 700 Governors Drive, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. Copies of the proposed rules are also available at: http://rules.sd.gov. Written comments must be received by August 11, 2016, to be considered. Individuals intending to present oral testimony at the hearing must make a written copy of their

testimony available to the department at the time of the hearing. Written comments and testimony must relate directly to the changes being proposed and must cite the specific rule number to which the comments are being directed. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place. Persons who have special needs for which the department can make arrangements are asked to call (605) 773-3165 at least 48 hours before the hearing.
