**NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES:** (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

***Department of Revenue and Regulation:***

***Division of Insurance:*** (July 21, 2008) intends to amend rules to require insurance companies to set policy reserves and nonforfeiture values for preneed insurance contracts based on the "Ultimate 1980 CSO" tables. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the division, is SDCL 58-15-43.12, 58-26-49, and 58-26-83.

A public hearing will be held in the Main Floor Conference Room, Anderson Building, Pierre, South Dakota, on August 29, 2008, at 10:00 a.m. Paper copies of the proposed rules may be obtained without charge from and written comments sent to the Department of Revenue and Regulation, Division of Insurance, Administrative Rules, 445 E.
