**Department of Education: South Dakota Board of Education:** (August 21, 2003) has filed a rule that will require that a minimum of three of the six renewal hours be college transcribed hours and that all six hours be related to the applicant's field of teaching when renewing a certificate. The general authority for this rule, as cited by the department, is SDCL 13-1-12.1 and 13-42-3.
