NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Public Safety: (August 18, 2008) intends to adopt an EMERGENCY rule to permit temporary use of one-half gallon pricing at retail fuel pumps. The general authority for this rule, as cited by the department, is SDCL 37-21-5.

Department of Social Services: Medical Services: (August 18, 2008) intends to amend rules relating generally to services provided to children, the effects of these rules will be to: no longer require cost sharing for any children under the age of 21; clarify that limits established for covered medical services or supplies do not apply to children if the service or supply is medically necessary and not experimental; for purposes of covered dental services, amend the term "contractor"; move the list of covered dental services and the associated procedure codes and rates of payment to the Department's website; for recipients age 21 and older, set a \$3 co-pay for each dental procedure provided; establish a mechanism under which a provider may request a Department review of a particular reimbursement rate for possible adjustment or request the inclusion or exclusion of a particular code from the list; and specify that an organ transplant for a child under the age of 21 is subject to prior approval, must be medically necessary, and may not be experimental. For rules relating specifically to Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) services, the effects of these changes will be to: delete the definitions of "clinical record," "community mental health center," "contractor," "core service agency,"

"diagnostic assessment," "equipment," "home-based therapy services," "mental health clinician," "multi-agency interdisciplinary committee," "qualified mental health professional," and "treatment plan"; repeal provisions relating to dental services, vision services, hearing services, organ transplants, psychological services, prescription drugs, physician services, home-based therapy services, home health services, psychiatric hospital services, and medical equipment; limit EPSDT services to screening services, orthodontic services, private duty nursing services; extended home health aide services, nutritional therapy, and immunizations; specify that nutritional items and supplies will continue to be covered under the provisions of chapter 67:16:42; transfer rules relating to the treatment of chemical dependency to chapter 67:54:08; for orthodontic treatment, require the treating dentist or orthodontist to complete and submit an orthodontic evaluation and assessment for purposes of prior approving the orthodontic service; delete language that related to partial screening services; incorporate by reference the periodicity schedule for preventive pediatric healthcare established by the American Association of Pediatrics; incorporate by reference the immunization recommendations established by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Center for Disease Control; specify that a child should have a dental screening by a dentist when the child is one year old and thereafter, the dental screening should follow the preventive pediatric healthcare schedule adopted by the American Association of Pediatrics; require a screening provider to refer a child to an appropriate specialist for a thorough dental, vision, or hearing exam when medically necessary; move

the rates of payment for EPSDT services to the Department's website and establish a mechanism under which a provider may request a Department review of a particular reimbursement rate for possible adjustment or request the inclusion or exclusion of a particular code from the list; deny payment for vaccine that is available through the South Dakota Department of Health's Vaccine for Children Program; reduce from 60 to 30 the number of days a provider has to furnish documentation to the Department that future costs of in-home services will decline and be within the threshold to allow continued eligibility for services; establish requirements for claims submitted for nutrition services, immunizations, and orthodontia services; and allow providers to submit claims in an electronic format. For rules relating specifically to the treatment of chemical dependency and substance abuse, the effects of these changes will be to: define the terms "accredited prevention or treatment facility," "adolescent," "chemical dependency counselor," "crisis intervention services," "day treatment program," "department," "division," "home station," "intensive outpatient treatment program," "intensive inpatient treatment program," "local group counseling," "local individual counseling," "low intensity residential treatment program," "outpatient services program," "recognized tribal program," "rural group counseling," "rural individual counseling," "short-term relapse treatment program," "standardized treatment needs assessment," and "unit"; establish lists of covered and non-covered chemical dependency and substance abuse treatment services; establish the eligibility criteria for the treatment of chemical dependency and substance abuse of adolescents and pregnant women; require prior authorization if care is expected to exceed the established service limit; establish the procedure codes and service limits for the covered services; allow a provider to submit an electronic claim; allow a tribal program to be a participating provider under certain circumstances; and require participating providers to meet the provisions of chapter

67:16:01 – General provisions, Chapter 67:16:26 – Third party liability, Chapter 67:16:33 – Provider requirements, Chapter 67:16:34 – Records, and Chapter 67:16:35 – Claims. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 28-6-1.

Individuals intending to present oral testimony at the hearing must make a written copy of their testimony available to the department at the time of the hearing. The testimony must relate directly to the changes being proposed and must cite the specific rule number to which the comments are being directed. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place. Persons who have special needs for which the department can make arrangements are asked to call (605) 773-3305 at least 48 hours before the hearing.

Department of Environment and Natural Resources: Water Management Board: (August 22, 2008) has filed rules to amend Ground Quality rules to require secondary containment and leak monitoring for new and replacement underground storage tank systems located within 1,000 feet of an existing community water system or any potable drinking water well, require department approved training for owners and operators of regulated underground storage tank systems and make it illegal for non-compliant underground storage tank systems to receive delivery of regulated substances.
