NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Transportation: (September 4, 2003) intends to amend rules that change speed zones as follows: a 65 mph speed zone on I-90 in Pennington County is being extended to the west at the west edge of Rapid City; a 45 mph speed zone on U.S. Hwy. 16 in Pennington County is being extended to the east from the junction with U.S. Hwy. 385 and a 35 mph speed zone at the junction is being eliminated; a 45 mph speed zone is being added to reduce speeds near commercial businesses along S.D. Hwy. 30 located near the intersection with Brookings Co. Road 25 in White; a speed zone in Kingsbury County on U.S. Hwy. 14 through DeSmet is being amended by extending the existing speed zones farther to the east and west of the city limits; a 45 mph speed zone along U.S. Hwy. 18 in Shannon County is being extended to the east at the east edge of Pine Ridge; and a 45 mph speed zone along U.S. Hwy. 18 in Shannon County is being extended to the east and west outward from Oglala. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 32-25-7.

A public hearing will be held at 9:05 a.m. (CDST) on September 25, 2003, in the Commission Room, Becker-Hansen Building, Pierre, South Dakota. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained without charge from and written comments sent to the Secretary of Transportation, Room 202, Becker-Hansen Building, 700 East Broadway Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501-2586. Written comments must be received on or before September 24, 2003, to be considered. This hearing is being

Department of Revenue and Regulation: (September 4, 2003) intends to amend rules to implement parts of Executive Reorganization Order No. 2003-01, as codified by SDCL 1-47-1 through 16, and SDCL 10-1-1, by changing the names of the Department of Commerce and Regulation, Secretary of Commerce and Regulation, Department of Revenue, and Secretary of Revenue to the Department of Revenue and Regulation and Secretary of Revenue and Regulation. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, are SDCL 10-1-17, 10-3-1.2, 10-10-6, 10-41-9, 10-43-42.1, 10-45-5.1, 10-45-47.1, 10-45D-13, 10-46-35.1, 10-47B-2, 10-50B-6, 10-52-4, 10-52A-7, 10-58-13, 10-59-38, 32-3-57, 32-10-3, 32-6B-33, 34A-13-16, 34A-13-22, 34A-13-40, 34A-13-42, 35-10-1, 36-21B-3, 47-31A-412, and 49-31-51.1.

A public hearing will be held at 10:00 a.m. on September 25, 2003, in Room 412, 4th floor, of the State Capitol located at 500 East Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota.
