**Executive Appointments:**

**Linda Barker**, Sioux Falls, was appointed on September 15, 2003, to the **Housing Development Authority**, to replace Kevin Culhane, effective November 1, 2003, and shall continue until June 30, 2005.

**Dr. Brent Lindbloom**, Pierre, was appointed on September 15, 2003, to the **State Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners**, to replace Dr. George Thompson, effective immediately and shall continue until July 1, 2008.

**Vivian Asmussen**, Pierre, was appointed on September 17, 2003, to the **Commission on Human Rights**, effective immediately and shall continue until June 30, 2005.

**Executive Orders:**

The Governor has signed **Executive Order 2003-05**. This order creates the South Dakota Medicaid Pharmaceutical and Therapeutics (P&T) Committee. The members are appointed by the Governor and the committee will be

administered by the Department of Social Services. It shall assist the Department in developing a list of drugs that will require prior authorization before being dispensed under the Medical Assistance Program. The term for the committee ends on June 30, 2005.

The Governor has signed **Executive Order 2003-06**. This order creates the South Dakota Family Support Council. It has fifteen members appointed by the Governor for varying terms of one to three years. The duties of the Council include advising the Division of Developmental Disabilities in the Department of Human Services regarding planning, policy, goals, implementation, and evaluation of family support services. It will help define the principles and philosophy of family support services and report annually to the Governor and the Legislature. The Division of Developmental Disabilities will pay the meeting expenses of the Council.

The Governor has signed **Executive Order 2003-07**. This order creates the Governor's Interagency Council on Homelessness. It will have at least eleven members consisting of various cabinet officials or a person designated by that official. Among other things the Council will coordinate state policy and working relationships among state agencies to identify and define issues relating to the homeless in South Dakota and the State's response to this issue. Staff of the participating state departments will assist the council. The council will report annually to the Governor.

The following agencies have permission from the Interim Rules Review Committee to charge for adopted rules: the Division of Insurance, the

Cosmetology Commission, the State Board of Examiners in Optometry, the State Plumbing Commission, the Board of Nursing, the Department of Social Services, the State Electrical Commission, the South Dakota Board of Pharmacy, the Real Estate Commission, the Gaming

Commission, the Department of Commerce and Regulation for commercial driver licensing, the Department of Labor for Article 47:03, and the Department of Revenue.
