NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council)

Department of Commerce and Regulation:
Electrical Commission: (October 9, 2002) intends to update rules associated with the 2002 National Electrical Code and SD State Wiring Bulletin. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the commission, is SDCL 36-16-12 and 36-16-29.

A public hearing will be held at the Americinn, Chamberlain, South Dakota, on November 18, 2002, at 10:00 a.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to the State Electrical Commission, 118 West Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. Written comments must be received by November 15, 2002, to be considered. Persons who have special needs for which the department can make arrangements are asked to call 1-800-233-7765 before the hearing.

DECLARATORY RULING:

The South Dakota Commission on Gaming has filed a Declaratory Ruling with the Legislative Research Council regarding the maximum bet allowed for the game known as "Monopoly Black Jack". The Commission declared that Monopoly Black Jack would be considered to be one gaming device. Thus the initial wager and the side bet allowed on the Monopoly bonus game cannot exceed more than \$100.

The Declaratory Ruling is dated October 1, 2002, and may be reviewed or copied at the office of the Legislative Research Council

during normal business hours.
