NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council)

Department of Game, Fish and Parks:

(November 13, 2001) is proposing rules to provide additional restrictions to possession of pets in state parks; provide additional recreation areas and lakeside use areas along the Missouri River where a valid park entrance license is required and remove Peoria Flats as an area requiring a park entrance license; repeal the license exemption at Farm Island during the designated time; increase the temporary park entrance license fees at Custer State Park; increase certain camping fees in Custer State Park and other areas within the state park system; change campground names; modify designations, additions, and classifications of certain campgrounds throughout the state; require campers who register at first come, first served sites to immediately occupy the campsite; and make modifications, additions, and deletions to water safety zones in Charles Mix, Day, and Walworth Counties. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 41-2-38, 41-17-1.1, 41-17-13, 41-17-13.4, and 42-8-1.1.

A public hearing will be held at the Ramkota River Centre, 920 West Sioux Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on Thursday, December 6, 2001, at 2:00 p.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to John L. Department of Commerce and Regulation:

Division of Insurance: (November 13, 2001) intends to adopt EMERGENCY RULES to correct inequities in the formula for the two percent cap on high-risk individuals. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the division, is SDCL 58-17-85 and 58-17-87.

Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from the South Dakota Division of Insurance, 118 West Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501-2000.

South Dakota Retirement System: (November 14, 2001) intends to adopt rules to comply with federal law and with certain investment selection provisions of state law; to improve the portability of retirement funds between and among various types of retirement plans and systems; to allow greater accumulation of retirement funds to and by members; to eliminate certain restrictions on accumulation of retirement funds by members; and to identify certain trust requirements for certain retirement funds. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the office, is SDCL 3-12-89.1, 3-13-49, and 3-13-54.

A public hearing will be held in the Lake Francis Case Room of the River Centre Convention Center, 920 West Sioux Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on Wednesday, December 5, 2001, at 2:00 p.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written

comments sent to the South Dakota Retirement System, PO Box 1098, Pierre, South Dakota 57501-1098. Written comments must be received by December 4, 2001, to be considered. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place. Persons who have special needs for which the office can make arrangements are asked to call (605) 773-3731 at least forty-eight hours before the hearing.

Department of Commerce and Regulation: Cement Plant Commission: (November 14, 2001) intends to adopt rules to terminate the old retirement plans and to reestablish new plans. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the commission, is SDCL 5-17-5 and 5-17-10.

A public hearing will be held in the Conference Room of the Stan Houston Equipment Company, 501 South Marion Road, Sioux Falls, South Dakota, on Friday, December 7, 2001, at 10:15 a.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to the South Dakota Cement Plant Commission, PO Box 360, Rapid City, South Dakota 57709. Written comments must be received by December 7, 2001, to be considered. Persons who have special needs for which the office can make arrangements are asked to call (605) 721-7100 before the hearing.
