HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 1001

1 A RESOLUTION, Proposing that the Honorable John Thune, member of the United States
2 House of Representatives, be made an honorary member of the House of Representatives of
3 the Seventy-third Session of the South Dakota Legislature on the eighteenth day of February
4 1998.

5 WHEREAS, John Thune, has earned his legislative experience in Washington D.C. and has
6 sharpened his basketball skills on the Potomac; and

7 WHEREAS, John Thune is known from Pierre to Washington D.C. for his great athletic
8 ability, and the South Dakota House or Representatives wishes to see his moves on the
9 basketball court in his home State of South Dakota; and

10 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives' team coach, Representative Dick Brown, has
11 grave concern about the hired mercenaries playing for the Senate team and recognizes the need
12 for real athletic talent; and

13 WHEREAS, the premier entertainment event of the 1998 South Dakota Legislative Session
14 is the basketball contest known as the Liberty Ball; and

15 WHEREAS, this is the first Liberty Ball basketball game sponsored by the Kids Voting

1 South Dakota Program and the game is a fund raiser benefitting our youth:

2 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-
3 third Legislature of the State of South Dakota, that John Thune is hereby deemed an honorary
4 member of the South Dakota House of Representatives for the eighteenth day of February 1998,
5 and that the House of Representatives requests Mr. Thune to bring his sweats and shoes and be
6 ready to play ball.
