1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding the disposition of
2 seized controlled weapons and firearms and to authorize a person licensed to carry a
3 concealed pistol in another state to carry a concealed pistol in this state under certain
4 conditions.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

6 Section 1. That § 23A-37-13 be amended to read as follows:

7 23A-37-13. Any controlled weapon or firearm used in violation of chapter 22-14 shall be
8 disposed of as follows:

- 9 (1) If it is stolen, it shall be returned to the lawful owner upon proof of ownership; or
10 (2) If it is illegal, it shall be destroyed pursuant to law; or
11 (3) If it is neither stolen nor illegal, it shall be delivered to the ~~sheriff in the county in~~
12 ~~which it was seized~~ arresting agency for lawful use or disposal.

13 In the case of a disposition pursuant to subdivision (3), the ~~sheriff shall provide for its sale~~
14 ~~at public auction within one year of delivery and shall deposit the proceeds in the county general~~
15 ~~fund. Such forfeiture shall be conducted in accord with the rules of civil procedure~~ arresting

1 agency may use, trade-in, or destroy the controlled weapon or firearm.

2 Section 2. That chapter 23-7 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
3 follows:

4 If a person has a valid license or permit issued by another state to carry a concealed pistol
5 in that state and if that state grants to residents of this state the right to carry a concealed pistol
6 without requiring a separate license or permit issued by that state, the person may carry a
7 concealed pistol in this state without a permit issued pursuant to this chapter and the other state's
8 license or permit is valid in this state.
