1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions related to enrollment and
2 attendance by secondary school students in postsecondary courses.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 13-28-37 be amended to read as follows:

5 13-28-37. Any secondary school student ~~in grades eleven and twelve~~ who is admitted to an
6 institution of higher education or a postsecondary vocational education institution as a special
7 student may enroll in ~~not more than two~~ courses ~~per fall or spring semester~~, which are offered
8 at the institution of higher education or postsecondary vocational education institution. ~~The~~
9 ~~student shall obtain the school district's approval of the postsecondary course prior to enrolling~~
10 ~~in the course. If approved, the~~ The secondary school in which the student is enrolled shall excuse
11 the student for attendance at the postsecondary course or courses, and the student shall receive
12 full credit toward high school graduation as well as postsecondary credit for successful
13 completion of the postsecondary course. The student shall notify the secondary school of
14 attendance at the postsecondary course and shall provide documentation to the secondary school
15 verifying enrollment in the postsecondary course. The resident school district may pay all or part
16 of the tuition and fees for a course approved for credit toward high school graduation in

1 accordance with this section. The student is responsible for any tuition and fees not paid by the
2 resident school district and for any other costs involved with attending a postsecondary
3 institution.

4 If a failing grade is received in a postsecondary course under this section, the student
5 receiving the failure is no longer eligible to enroll for postsecondary courses under this section.
