

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Requesting the United States Congress to exempt agricultural commodities and products from economic sanctions.

WHEREAS, agriculture is the number one industry in South Dakota and is the bedrock of South Dakota's economy; and

WHEREAS, many South Dakotans rely on the agricultural industry to make a living; and

WHEREAS, the agricultural industry in South Dakota and in the United States is experiencing financial difficulties; and

WHEREAS, of the approximately five billion people in the world, approximately three billion people in seventy countries are prevented from doing business with the United States because of some form of economic sanction:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the Seventy-fourth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the House of Representatives concurring therein, that the United States Congress is hereby requested to exempt all agricultural commodities and products when imposing any economic sanctions on foreign countries.
