SENATE BILL NO. 151

Introduced by: Senators de Hueck and Brown (Arnold) and Representatives Duniphan and Smidt

1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to allow for the publishing of certain minutes on the
2 internet.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 13-8-35 be amended to read as follows:

5 13-8-35. Within twenty days after a meeting of the school board, the board shall cause to be
6 published in the designated legal newspaper a full account of the unapproved proceedings of such
7 meeting, giving a detailed statement of all expenditures of money, with the names of persons to
8 whom payment is made, showing the service rendered or goods furnished, a detailed statement
9 of receipts, and balance on hand. Expenditures and receipts of trust and agency funds may be
10 published in total only.

11 If the published minutes of the previous meeting of the board are modified, amended, or
12 corrected by such board subsequent to such publication and prior to approval by the board, such
13 changes shall be reflected in the minutes of the meeting at which such modifications,
14 amendments, or corrections are made.

15 The business manager shall sign each legal publication submitted to the newspaper. However,

1 the school board of a school district in first class municipality may publish its minutes on the
2 internet in lieu of publishing the minutes in the designated legal newspaper.

3 Section 2. That § 9-18-1 be amended to read as follows:

4 9-18-1. The governing body of every municipality shall cause to be published in the official
5 legal newspaper therein, or, if no official legal newspaper is published therein, in any legal
6 newspaper which serves such municipality, within thirty days after each meeting thereof the
7 minutes of the meeting containing a full account of the proceedings at such meeting, giving a
8 detailed statement of all expenditures of money, the names of the persons to whom payment is
9 made, and showing the service rendered therefor. It shall pay for publishing such proceedings
10 not to exceed ninety percent of the legal line rates for weekly newspapers and not to exceed the
11 legal line rate for daily newspapers, as provided in § 17-2-19. However, the governing body of
12 a first class municipality may publish its minutes on the internet in lieu of publishing the minutes
13 in the official legal newspaper.
