HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1006

Introduced by: Representatives Peterson (Bill), Garnos, Hunhoff, Rhoden, Teupel, and Wick
and Senators Bogue, Koskan, McCracken, and Schoenbeck

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Requesting that the United States Congress enact a
2 Medicare prescription drug benefit.

3 WHEREAS, the use of prescription drugs improves the quality of care and helps patients live
4 healthier, longer, and more productive lives while keeping them out of more costly acute care
5 settings in the long term; and

6 WHEREAS, the increased use of new and improved prescription drugs has changed the
7 delivery of health care in the United States since Medicare was enacted; and

8 WHEREAS, Congress did not enact a drug benefit in the Medicare program, therefore the
9 program is inadequate in providing the elderly and disabled the most appropriate drug therapies,
10 preventing the delivery of quality health care at an affordable cost; and

11 WHEREAS, the private sector provides affordable coverage by negotiating discounts on
12 drugs and meeting the needs of special populations with chronic diseases by coordinating care
13 with disease management, drug utilization review, and patient education programs; and

14 WHEREAS, comprehensive reform of the Medicare program would utilize the successful
15 tools of the private sector in coordinating care for this population and consider the use of the



1 marketplace to foster competition among private plans, resulting in more choices of quality
2 coverage for seniors and the disabled while maintaining the financial sustainability of the
3 program; and

4 WHEREAS, Congress has failed to provide for comprehensive reform of Medicare, instead
5 encouraging states to use their own resources to ease the burden of their elderly and disabled
6 populations and effectively assume an unfunded, informal mandate; and

7 WHEREAS, in implementing state programs to assist the Medicare population, state
8 budgetary constraints can often result in requirements to restrict and limit the patients' access to
9 needed prescription drugs:

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-
11 eighth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the
12 Legislature of the State of South Dakota requests that the United States House of
13 Representatives and the United States Senate enact financially sustainable, voluntary, universal,
14 and privately administered out-patient prescription drug coverage as part of the federal Medicare
15 program.
