

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1005

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Expressing the deep respect of the Legislature on the occasion of the passing of Loren Carlson.

WHEREAS, Loren Carlson spent his life serving the public; and

WHEREAS, Loren Carlson served the Legislature as the first full-time director of the Legislative Research Council from 1955 to 1959; and

WHEREAS, Loren Carlson served as South Dakota's first budget director from 1963 to 1968; and

WHEREAS, Loren Carlson worked in Congress as the administrative assistant to U.S. Senators Francis Case and Joseph Bottum and to U.S. Representative Larry Pressler; and

WHEREAS, Loren Carlson was a professor of political science at the University of South Dakota, teaching South Dakota government and politics to hundreds of students, many of whom are now leaders in the State:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-ninth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that a lifetime of achievement, dedication, and public service be recognized in the person of Loren Carlson.
