## SENATE BILL NO. 52

Introduced by: The Committee on Health and Human Services at the request of the  
Department of Health

1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions concerning the fees for  
2 controlled substances registration.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 34-20B-41 be amended to read as follows:

5 34-20B-41. The Department of Health may ~~adopt~~ promulgate rules pursuant to chapter 1-26  
6 relating to exclusions from uniform drug articles pursuant to subdivision 34-20B-2(1); the  
7 definition of precursors; exceptions from Schedule III of stimulants, depressants, and anabolic  
8 steroid-estrogen combinations in medicinal preparations; the registration of manufacturers,  
9 distributors, and dispensers; waivers of registration; the suspending, revoking, surrendering,  
10 transferring, and reinstating of registration; inventories and records of controlled substances  
11 establishing minimum standards for prescribing and dispensing practices, labeling and security  
12 requirements and the issuance of prescriptions as provided by this chapter and chapter 22-42;  
13 and the inspection of registered premises. The department may charge reasonable fees relating  
14 to the registration and control of the manufacture, distribution, and dispensing of controlled  
15 drugs and substances within this state. No fee may exceed one hundred dollars.



1 Section 2. That § 34-20B-31 be repealed.

2 ~~34-20B-31. Doctors of medicine, osteopathy, physician's assistants, dentistry, podiatry,~~  
3 ~~optometry, or veterinary medicine, and pharmacists licensed or certified to practice their~~  
4 ~~profession, and licensed pharmacies, in this state shall be deemed to have complied with the~~  
5 ~~registration requirements of § 34-20B-29, without the payment of an additional fee.~~
