SENATE BILL NO. 112

1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to repeal certain requirements related to works of art in
2 state buildings.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 1-22-10 be amended to read as follows:

5 1-22-10. Any state building constructed, remodeled or renovated after December 31, 1989,
6 shall include works of art for public display. ~~To that end, the state engineer shall certify the total~~
7 ~~cost of the original construction, remodeling or renovation of any state building, and there shall~~
8 ~~be appropriated a sum equal to at least one percent of such cost for the purpose of including~~
9 ~~works of art in, or on the grounds of, the building.~~

10 Sections 1-22-9 to 1-22-17, inclusive, do not apply to projects less than one hundred
11 thousand dollars or to projects where the primary purpose is to remove asbestos, PCBs or other
12 hazardous materials. ~~At least ten percent of the one percent allocated for art under §§ 1-22-9 to~~
13 ~~1-22-17, inclusive, shall be transferred to the fund created in § 1-22-11 during the planning and~~
14 ~~design stage of the state building for which funds have been appropriated.~~

15 Section 2. That § 1-22-11 be amended to read as follows:



1 1-22-11. A special revolving fund is established within the state treasury to be known as the
2 art for state buildings fund. The fund shall be budgeted and expended in accordance with Title
3 4 on warrants drawn by the state auditor on vouchers approved by the secretary of Tourism and
4 State Development and shall be used for acquisition of art as provided in §§ 1-22-9 to 1-22-17,
5 inclusive, and for expenses incurred in the administration of §§ 1-22-9 to 1-22-17, inclusive.

6 The fund may derive income from:

- 7 (1) ~~The transfer of appropriations pursuant to § 1-22-10;~~
- 8 (2) Grants;
- 9 (3) Gifts; or
- 10 (4) Other appropriations made by the Legislature.
