Introduced by: The Committee on Appropriations at the request of the Governor

1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to make an appropriation to construct instructional
2 classrooms, to require certain reporting, and to declare an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum of eight million dollars (\$8,000,000), or so
5 much thereof as may be necessary, of general funds to the Board of Regents to build an
6 instructional classroom building in Sioux Falls to provide the physical resources needed for
7 classrooms, offices, student support services, and labs for undergraduate and graduate programs.

8 Section 2. The design and construction of the facility approved by this Act shall be under
9 the general supervision of the Bureau of Administration as provided in § 5-14-2. The
10 commissioner of the Bureau of Administration and the executive director of the Board of
11 Regents shall approve vouchers and the state auditor shall draw warrants to pay expenditures
12 authorized by section 1 of this Act.

13 Section 3. The construction of the instructional classroom building pursuant to this Act is
14 contingent on the purchase of land located in Minnehaha County by the Board of Regents.

15 Section 4. That § 13-39-70 be amended to read as follows:



1 13-39-70. There is hereby created within the vocational education facilities fund ~~of the~~
2 ~~secretary of education~~ a tuition subaccount. The secretary may determine and require that all or
3 any portion of the tuition and other student fees payable to an LEA shall be deposited in the
4 subaccount. No moneys may be disbursed from the tuition subaccount for any purpose other
5 than to pay lease rentals or other amounts due and owing in connection with ~~any~~:

6 (1) Any facility originally leased to the board of regents but now utilized for vocational
7 education so long as such facility is on the campus of a postsecondary technical
8 institute; and

9 (2) Any lease-purchase agreement authorized under §§ 13-39-66 and 13-39-67 unless
10 and until the health and educational facilities authority files with the state treasurer
11 a certification that it has on deposit or there has otherwise been appropriated
12 sufficient moneys to pay all amounts due or to become due within the next three
13 months on all such lease-purchase agreements.

14 No lease rentals on facilities described in subsection (1) shall be paid unless the secretary
15 of education has approved the assumption of the former board of regents' lease obligations by
16 the tuition subaccount. Thereafter, the state treasurer shall retain in the vocational education
17 facilities fund for future repair and improvement as authorized by the Legislature such amounts,
18 not to exceed ten percent thereof, as the secretary shall direct.

19 Section 5. That § 4-7-6 be amended to read as follows:

20 4-7-6. The commissioner of administration, attorney general, state treasurer, state
21 auditor-general, secretary of revenue, ~~and state auditor,~~ and the executive director of the Board
22 of Regents shall render such advice and assistance, and furnish such information to the Bureau
23 of Finance and Management as may be requested.

24 Section 6. Whereas, this Act is necessary for the support of the state government and its

- 1 existing public institutions, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in
- 2 full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
