1 A JOINT RESOLUTION, Proposing and submitting to the electors at the next general election
2 an amendment to Article XIV of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota to clarify
3 which educational institutions are under the control of the Board of Regents.

4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF SOUTH
5 DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

6 Section 1. That at the next general election held in the state, the following amendment to
7 Article XIV, section 3 of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, as set forth in section
8 2 of this Joint Resolution, which is hereby agreed to, shall be submitted to the electors of the
9 state for approval.

10 Section 2. That Article XIV, section 3 of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, be
11 amended to read as follows:



1 § 3. ~~The Any four-year state university, the agriculture college, the school of mines and~~
2 ~~technology, the normal schools or college, any off-campus center for any state university or~~
3 ~~college, a school for the deaf, and a school for the blind, and all other educational institutions~~
4 ~~that may be sustained either wholly or in part by the state shall be under the control of a board~~
5 of five members appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the senate under such rules and
6 restrictions as the Legislature shall provide. The Legislature may increase the number of
7 members to nine.
