

# Methamphetamine Treatment

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- Individuals with a methamphetamine addiction can access an array of community-based substance use disorder services depending on their specific needs, including:
  - Outpatient Treatment Services
  - Low Intensity Residential Services (aka Halfway House)
  - Inpatient Treatment Services
  - Detox Services
- In addition, there are two Intensive Methamphetamine Treatment Programs

# Community Intensive Methamphetamine Treatment

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- Long-term treatment that consists of four phases to assist individuals with severe methamphetamine dependence:
  - Phase 1: provides detoxification services for clients experiencing acute withdrawal symptoms
  - Phase 2: provides intensive day treatment (20-29 hours per week) or intensive inpatient treatment (30 hours per week) for approximately 30 to 45 days
  - Phase 3: provides transition to a low-intensity residential program along with intensive outpatient treatment (9-15 hours per week) for approximately 90 to 120 days
  - Phase 4: provides transition to an independent living situation and continues outpatient treatment for up to 8 months
- Two treatment programs located in Sioux Falls area and Rapid City



# Intensive Methamphetamine Treatment Expansion

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- SB 43 An Act to make an appropriation to expand intensive methamphetamine treatment services within the Dept. of Social Services
- Expansion of \$603,740 in one-time funding
- With the increase in arrest rates, additional meth treatment resources are needed
- In FY15, 13% of state-funded community behavioral health clients entered treatment with a primary diagnosis of amphetamine dependence; 8% nationwide
- Expansion will support a full continuum of evidence-based meth treatment services

# Correctional Intensive Methamphetamine Treatment

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- Intensive correctional based treatment program for women inmates with methamphetamine diagnosis or who show a need for structured, long-term services in order to progress in recovery
  - Phase 1 and 2: Completed in the South Dakota Women's prison in Pierre. Programming is 5 days a week for 90 days.
  - Phase 3: Individuals transition to a community based low-intensity residential program, along with intensive outpatient treatment for approximately 90 days. Client receive 5-16 hours of treatment per week
  - Phase 4: provides transition to an independent living situation and continues outpatient treatment for up to 6 months
- SFY16 Clients Served: 90 Adult Women
