

Information provided by the Department of Social Services

- SD compared Nationally (National Survey on Drug Use and Health, SAMHSA 2016-2017)
 - An estimated 0.88% of South Dakota's population (7,600 of 868,799 residents) 12 and older used methamphetamine in the past year compared to 0.56% nationally.
 - Compared to surrounding states, South Dakota has the second highest percentage of individuals 12 and older who used methamphetamine in the past year.

- Publicly Funded Treatment Data
 - In State Fiscal Year 2019, 2,383 individuals with a methamphetamine use disorder accessed publicly funded treatment, including outpatient services and residential services through private providers. Of the 2,383 individuals with a methamphetamine use disorder, 250 had a severe methamphetamine use disorder and accessed publicly funded services at an intensive methamphetamine treatment (IMT) provider.
 - In SFY19, there were four IMT providers.

- Access to Services
 - For the intensive meth treatment (IMT) services, the five private providers regularly report their access information to the Division of Behavioral Health. This information can change quickly; however, as of 07/30/2019, the five providers reported 5 individuals waiting to start intensive meth treatment (IMT) services.
 - In SFY20, the number of IMT providers increased from four to five.
