NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

Department of Human Services: Certification Board for Alcohol & Drug Professionals: (March 15, 2006) intends to adopt rules to establish requirements for the certification process as it relates to alcohol and drug professionals in South Dakota; to define terms used within the article; to define certification and recognition levels as it relates to certified alcohol and drug professionals and trainees; application process; fee schedule; academic and experience requirements; define the supervision requirements and duties; define the examination process; continuing professional training requirements; requirements for renewal, upgrade or change of status; complaint process; and national certification and reciprocity. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 36-34-12, 36-34-13, 36-34-14, 36-34-15, 36-34-16, 36-34-18, 36-34-21, and 36-34-23.

A public hearing will be held in Room 412 of the Capitol Building, 500 E. Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on Thursday, April 20, 2006, from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. (CST). choice units in the first drawing; amend Archery Elk Hunting Season to establish the number/types of licenses/tags available in applicable archery hunting Units; amend Black Hills Elk Hunting Season to establish the number/types of licenses/tags available in applicable hunting Units; amend Prairie Elk Hunting Season to establish the number/types of licenses/tags available in applicable and modified hunting Units; modify the hunt Units in Bennett County and establish the hunting season dates within the Bennett County hunting Units; amend Mountain Goat Hunting Season to modify the hunting season dates; amend Black Hills Bighorn Sheep Hunting Season to modify the hunting season dates; amend Grouse Hunting Season to modify the shooting hours (sunrise to sunset) for the hunting season – statewide; amend Pheasant Hunting Season to modify (lengthen) hunting season in Unit 2; amend Resident Pheasant Hunting Season to remove reference to bag limits relating to the youth pheasant season; amend Gray Partridge Hunting Season to modify the shooting hours (sunrise to sunset) for the hunting season – statewide; amend Cottontail Rabbit Hunting Season to make modifications to the hunting season; amend Mourning Dove Hunting Season to make modifications to the hunting season and remove the Eurasian collared dove from the classification of a mourning dove; and amend Dog Training to repeal the dog training prohibitions applicable to certain portions of the Fort Pierre National Grasslands and school and public lands and repeal the permitted and conditional use of horses in the training of dogs on public land. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 41-2-18, 41-6-10, 41-6-18.4, 41-6-19.6, 41-6-21, 41-6-78, 41-11-5, and 41-17-1.1.

Department of Revenue and Regulation:

Division of Insurance: (March 17, 2006) intends to amend rules to require prominent and clear disclosures in Credit Life, Health, and Unemployment Insurance applications and documents; to allow producers to obtain continuing education credit through company sponsored courses; to exempt certain life insurance riders from long term care requirements; to allow a person who maintained a physical residence in South Dakota for at least one year in the prior ten years remain eligible for the South Dakota risk pool; and to require enrollees with the South Dakota Risk Pool board to pay their amounts due to medical providers as a condition of continued eligibility. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the division, is SDCL 58-4-1, 58-17-87, 58-17-124, 58-17B-4, 58-19-34, and 58-30-117.
