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**NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES:** (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

**Department of Labor: Electrical Commission:** (March 25, 2008) intends to adopt the 2008 National Electrical Code. The general authority for this rule, as cited by the commission, is SDCL 36-16-12.

A public hearing will be held at the Americinn Lodge & Suite, Chamberlain, South Dakota, on April 25, 2008, at 10:00 a.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to the State Electrical Commission, 308 S. Pierre Street, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. Written comments must be received by April 18, 2008, to be considered. Persons who have special needs for which the commission can make arrangements are asked to call 1-800-233-7765 before the hearing.

**Department of Agriculture: Weed and Pest Control Commission:** (March 25, 2008) intends to amend a rule that will add Phragmites to the local noxious weed list and to add scientific names for all local noxious weeds and declared pests. The general authority for this rule, as cited by the commission, is SDCL 38-22-9 and 38-22-11.1.

A public hearing will be held at the Governor's Inn, 700 W. Sioux Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota, on April 29, 2008, at 1:00 p.m. CDT. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained from and written comments sent to South Dakota Department of Agriculture, Division of Agricultural Services, Weed and Pest Control, 523 E. Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. Material sent by mail must reach the

department by April 28, 2008, to be considered. For access assistance, handicapped persons may call (605) 773-3796, before the hearing.

**Department of Revenue and Regulation: Real Estate Commission:** (March 28, 2008) intends to adopt rules to establish fees for a certificate of licensure, additional license, change of business address, change of association, duplicate license, and late renewal fees. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the commission, is SDCL 36-21A-12.1, 36-21A-60, 36-21A-66, 36-21A-89, and 43-15B-6.

A public hearing will be held in the second floor conference room of the George Mickelson Criminal Justice Center, 1302 East Highway 14, Pierre, South Dakota at 9:00 a.m. CDT on May 8, 2008. Written comments must be received on or before May 6, 2008, to be considered. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place. 		<p>ending date from the first Sunday of January to January 31; amend a Grouse Hunting Season rule to establish season dates, open areas, shooting hours, and daily bag and possession limits; and adjust the season ending date from the first Sunday of January to January 31; amend a Sage Grouse Hunting Season rule to establish season dates, open areas, shooting hours, and bag limit (1 sage grouse per year); and adjust the season dates to the last Wednesday and Thursday of September; amend a Quail Hunting Season rule to establish season dates, open areas, shooting hours, and daily bag and possession limits; and adjust the season ending date from the first Sunday of January to January 31; amend a Partridge Hunting Season rule to establish season dates, open areas, shooting hours, and daily bag and possession limits; and adjust the season ending date from the first Sunday of January to January 31; amend a Black Hills Elk Hunting Season rule to establish season dates for "any elk" and "anterless elk" (first and second season) licenses, types and numbers of available licenses, open areas, and shooting hours; adjust the number of licenses available from 855 "any elk" and 1,220 "anterless elk" licenses (total of 2,075 licenses) to 755 "any elk" and 920 "anterless elk" licenses (total of 1,675 licenses); and adjust the unit boundary for Unit H1 and H7; amend a Custer State Park Elk Hunting Season (Any Elk) rule to establish season dates for the "any elk" licenses, number of available licenses, open areas, and shooting hours; and adjust the number of resident licenses available from 41 "any elk" licenses to 36 "any elk" licenses; amend Custer State Park Deer Hunting Season rules to establish season dates for the Custer State Park deer (Units 1, 2 and 3) licenses, types and number of available licenses, open areas, and shooting hours; would add an additional "anterless whitetail deer" license with the licenses already authorized for Units 1 and 2 to create a double tag for these units; adjust the number of 2-tag muzzleloader anterless white-tailed deer licenses available in Unit 3 from 25 licenses to 35 licenses; and</p>

4-8-2008	Labor: Division of Labor and Management	Update the Workers' Compensation Fee Schedule and revise the application requirements for Case Management rules; 34 SDR 234.
4-8-2008	Human Services: Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse	Amend rules to define case management, case manager, division director, evidence based research, liaison activities, probation, and standardized treatment needs assessment and to delete definitions of ASAM, assessment, at risk individuals, catchment area, chemical health, controlled drugs, core service agency, DEA, INH, incapacitated by alcohol and other drugs, independent peer review process, intoxicated person, personal growth, prevention certification, qualified nursing personnel, SDCDCCB, Schedule II, III, or IV drugs, and treatment needs assessment. For rules pertaining to accreditation the effect of these rule changes will be to change pre-accreditation process to a provision process, increase the time allowed for the decision to notify an agency regarding renewal from 30 to 90 days, increases the accreditation period by one year for each level, adds timelines not previously provided in rule regarding notification to the agency, adds new rules regarding probation, suspension, revocation, or adding new clients if an agency is on a probationary or suspended status, appeal and time and place for hearing for an agency to appeal the division's decision. For rules pertaining to management the effect of these rule changes will be to clarify which type of agencies must be incorporated, updates the list of prohibited discrimination to include mental or physical illness, updates the fiscal practices to reflect current practices, updates the tuberculin infection control and screening requirements for employees to reflect current CDS guidelines, adds a new rule on outcome measures requiring the collection of evidence based pre- and post-test data on clients receiving prevention services, and repeals

		several rules regarding personnel management. For rules pertaining to client rights the effect of these changes will be to add to the list of guaranteed rights of the client, update federal references to HIPAA to ensure privacy of protected health information, and update the discharge policy requirements to include clients leaving against medical or staff advice. For rules pertaining to programming the effect of these rule changes will be to update the process on quality care reviews changing it from three open to three closed files, update the purpose and scope of prevention programs, add a new rule on prevention classification and determining evidence based intervention, clarifies the description of services, clarifies continued service criteria, updates rules on staffing and hours of operation, adds rules on tuberculin screening for clients, patient placement criteria, adds or updates rules on drug and alcohol testing of clients, and updates all of the program titles; 34 SDR 241.
