**NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES:** (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

**Department of Labor: Board of Technical Professions:** (August 6, 2007) has filed rules to clarify, such as adding definitions, adding a new section for a business waiver, correcting mistakes, adding NCARB's "Broadly Experienced Architect", adding NCEES policy section, request for disabled examinees to make accommodations from exam vendors, and late renewals are to submit reinstatement applications. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the board, is SDCL 36-18A-22, 36-18A-27, 36-18A-37, 36-18A-39, 36-18A-40, 36-18A-42, and 36-18A-43.

A public hearing will be held in Room 304, 3<sup>rd</sup> floor, 2040 W. #### **Executive Order:**

The Governor has signed **Executive Order 2007-19** dated August 10, 2007, which declares that a state of emergency exists statewide, and that the transportation of diesel, ethanol, gasoline and propane within South Dakota shall be exempt from 49 CFR Part 395, otherwise known as the federal hours of service regulations. The executive order shall expire upon conclusion of the emergency, but no later than midnight, September 9, 2007.
